**Title: Through Truck, Truck and Trailer, and Semitrailer Combination Restriction –
Route 17 Business (Main Street)
Gloucester County**

WHEREAS, in response to a formal request by the Gloucester County Board of Supervisors that Route 17 Business (Main Street) in Gloucester County between Route 17 North intersection (George Washington Memorial Highway) and Routes 3/14 (John Clayton Memorial Highway) be considered for restriction of through traffic by trucks, truck and trailers, and semitrailer combinations pursuant to the provisions of Section 46.2-809 of the Code of Virginia, this matter has been carefully reviewed; and

WHEREAS, the Gloucester County Board of Supervisors has conducted a public hearing on this requested restriction; and

WHEREAS, the route in question traverses a predominantly commercial and residential area; and

WHEREAS, a restriction on the proposed route would not present any undue hardship; and

WHEREAS, proper notice was given by posting signs and publishing notices advising the public of the proposed restriction and requesting written comments; and

WHEREAS, careful consideration has been given to the recommendations received, the available alternate routes and the past practices of the Commonwealth Transportation Board,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, pursuant to the provisions of Section 46.2-809 of the Code of Virginia, that Route 17 Business (Main Street) in Gloucester County between Route 17 North intersection (George Washington Memorial Highway) and Routes 3/14 (John Clayton Memorial Highway) be prohibited to through traffic of trucks, truck and trailers, and semitrailer combinations as defined in Section 46.2-100 of the Code of Virginia.
