Background

- Purpose: planning and evaluation of options to address transportation needs
- Item 442 of the 2006 Appropriations Act
 - \$6 Million for FY07
 - \$5 Million for FY08
- Item 454 of the 2009 Budget Bill
 - \$4 Million in FY09
 - \$4 Million in FY10
 - \$2 Million each year for Advance Activities
- Office of Intermodal Planning and Investment required to make recommendations to the CTB

FY07 & FY08 Allocations


Item	Amount
Funds for Required Projects	\$5,510,000
Training and Support for Traffic Studies	\$500,000
Economic Impact of Investment	\$250,000
Multimodal and Land Use Plan Development Assistance	\$2,750,000
Local and Regional Corridor Planning Grant Program	\$1,990,000
TOTAL	\$11,000,000

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Grant Programs

- Goal : to assist localities in planning multimodally & linking land use with transportation decisions
- Status:
 - 81 applications for \$12.6 Million
 - 31 awarded for \$4.6 Million
 - Six grant studies are completed
 - All completed studies are on the Office of Intermodal Planning and Investment web site listed under Grant Program

Multimodal Grants

- 8 Grants to develop Land Use and Transportation Plans
- 5 Grants to develop Multimodal Corridor Studies
- 8 Grants to advance Transit (Bus/Rail)
- 4 Grants to develop Bicycle and/or Pedestrian and Ferry Plans
- 1 Grant to assess Strategies to Reduce Greenhouse Gas Emissions
- 5 Grants to prepare Freight Studies

Multimodal Grant Program: Completed Studies

- New River Valley Planning District Commission: Employment Mobility Study
- Virginia Regional Transit Development Plan
- Caroline County Transit Oriented Development Study
- A Multi-jurisdictional study of Transportation Access, Land Use and Zoning Issues Surrounding Farmville Regional Airport
- New Kent Barge Study
- Transportation/Land Use Connections (TLC)


Multimodal Grant Program: Completed Studies

- New River Valley Planning District Commission: Employment Mobility Study
 - Coordinated providers, analyzed commuter patterns
 - Recommended 7 new routes initially to best serve commuters; estimated costs and developed a plan for next steps
- Virginia Regional Transit Development Plan Identifies improvements to transit over VRT's system
 - Eg. Convert Waynesboro Demand Response Service to Deviated Fixed Route Service

Caroline County Transit Oriented Development Study

- Evaluated concept of transit village in Carmel Church including a potential rail station
- Identified possible station sites, land uses within .28 mile radius of proposed station, developed circulation plan, reviewed environmental issues and green considerations
- Forcasted travel and recommended improvements

Caroline County Transit Oriented Development Study



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FY2009 Recommendations:

- Support for localities to address Urban Development Areas: \$3Million
- Reserve \$1 Million for Advance Activities
- Multimodal Grant Program: \$500,000
- Support for Intermodal office
 - Eg. Regional Performance Measures \$500,000

Urban Development Areas

- HB 3202 (Section 15.2-2223.1 of the Code) requires cities, counties and towns with
 - Population above 20,000 and growth of 5%; or,
 - Growth of 15%

to amend the comprehensive plans to incorporate urban development areas (UDAs)

- An UDA is an area designated appropriate for higher density development due to proximity to transportation facilities, availability of water and sewer, or proximity to a city or other development
- An UDA reduces the demand on transportation

- Commonwealth will provide use of on-call consulting assistance
- Locality agrees to amend comp plan and to revise zoning and subdivision ordinances to allow for design intended in urban development areas
- If locality decides not to amend, the grant amount will be returned to the Commonwealth
- Locality may have the option to set up road impact fee program based on funding availability
