## Title: Invitation for Participation by Elected Officials in the Route 29 Corridor Study

**WHEREAS**, the Route 29 Corridor (the Corridor) is one of the major north-south routes in the Commonwealth, and connects Northern Virginia with North Carolina (a distance of 219 miles); and

**WHEREAS,** the Corridor is designated as a National Highway System (NHS) Route, and is a major artery for the Eastern Seaboard; and

**WHEREAS**, the Corridor serves both long-distance and local traffic, the interests of which can often be in conflict; and

**WHEREAS,** many studies have been performed on the Corridor, but none have addressed the entire Corridor in an inclusive manner; and

**WHEREAS,** the Commonwealth Transportation Board funded a comprehensive study of the Corridor to develop a plan for the Corridor to coordinate land development and transportation improvements; and

**WHEREAS**, the Corridor is a major asset of the Commonwealth, and the General Assembly is the steward of these assets; and

**WHEREAS**, the Commonwealth Transportation Board (the Board) held a meeting on January 16, 2008, with affected General Assembly members and other elected officials, to present the study plan and solicit comments on the plan; and

**WHEREAS,** the General Assembly members offered their assistance in support of the study; and

**WHEREAS,** several public meetings were held to which General Assembly members were invited, but few were able to attend.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED,** that the Board invites you to attend an upcoming corridor-wide meeting and the Board encourages greater participation by General Assembly members in the Route 29 Corridor Study.
