Virginia strives to maximize the use of Federal dollars and again has qualified for "bonus obligation" authority from the Federal Highway Administration in the amount of \$28,248,411.

- Based on current Strategy and planned obligations, Virginia focused its effort on bridges, paving, congestion and transit when allocating funds. We also reviewed local and regional requests.
- Bonus OA projects had to be obligated by September 25, 2009. We received notice of our new OA on September 8, 2009.
- Federal Requirements:
  - A State must have obligated its total FFY09 Federal Strategy
  - A State is restricted to the use of available categorical funds
  - Projects must be in the FY 2010-2015 SYIP
  - Project phases must be included in STIP/TIP
