

Project Location





Project Description

- Whiting Road, LLC is a reload lumber and plywood facility for Annandale Millwork/Allied Systems **Corporations**
- Construction of 2730 feet of track to provide access to facility
- □ Project cost: \$505,000
- □ Project has the support of the Virginia Economic **Development Partnership and Frederick County Board of Supervisors**
- Rail service to be provided by CSX
- Whiting Road, LLC has requested and accelerated approval of the application to avoid delays in construction due to inclement weather



Project Benefits

- Local capital investment of \$3.3 million, and creation of two new jobs
- Rail access will enable approximately 500 railcar shipments (1,500 – 2,000 truck loads) per year

Project Evaluation

- Projects are evaluated based on the following criteria:
 - Number of annual carloads
 - Employment
 - Commonwealth's portion of track construction per initial capital investment cost
 - Jurisdictional unemployment rate compared to statewide
 - Project endorsement by the Virginia Economic Development Partnership or Department of Business Assistance to bring or expand industry in Virginia
 - Non-state contributions to track construction
 - Contribution to the long term viability of a rail line
- This project is recommended for funding.



Recommended Project Funding

Applicant	Total Project Cost	Recommended CTB Allocation	Local Match
Whiting Road, LLC	\$505,000	\$400,000	\$105,000

The Rail Industrial Access program specifies that no more than \$300,000 of unmatched funds may be allocated to any one project in any fiscal year. Rail Industrial Access funds in excess of \$300,000 are matched dollar-for-dollar by the grantee or from other nonprogram sources.
