

Transportation Enhancement Program Overview and Proposed Policy Changes

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Program Overview

- Mandatory 10% STP Program Set-Aside
 - Receive ~ 150-200 project applications annually
 - CTB allocates funds to ~ 100 projects annually
- 12 eligibility categories
- Current CTB Policy (November 2009)
 - Annual allocation (~\$15M-\$20M) divided equally among members
 - Consider all eligible projects thru FY2013
 - Applications scored annually (2006 CTB resolution)
 - Funding requests limited to \$1M annually per project
 - Must fund a minimum of 50% of requested amount
 - Must fully fund projects requesting < \$200,000
 - Projects must be complete within 4 yrs. of CTB allocation

Eligible Categories

- 1. Pedestrian and Bicycle Facilities
- 2. Pedestrian and Bicycle Safety and Education
- 3. Acquisition of Scenic or Historic Easements and Sites
- 4. Scenic or Historic Highway Programs, including Tourist and Welcome Centers
- 5. Landscaping and Scenic Beautification along Corridors
- 6. Historic Preservation

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- Rehabilitation of Historic Transportation Buildings, Structures or Facilities
- 8. Preservation of Abandoned Railway Corridors for Conversion to Trails
- 9. Inventory Control, and Removal of Outdoor Advertising
- 10. Archeological Planning and Research
- 11. Environmental Mitigation and Runoff Pollution and Provision of Wildlife Connectivity
- 12. Establishment of Transportation Museums

FY2010-2011 Statewide Tourism Initiative:

Focus a portion of allocations on an assortment of activities centered around the sesquicentennial of the Civil War, job creation and tourism as follows:

• Promotion of Virginia's Scenic Road Program

- Multi-media solution to communicate historic and scenic tourism around the Commonwealth
 - Available at Virginia's Welcome Centers (with goal to make available at certain rest areas as well)
- Tourism categories currently included in Virginia's Scenic Road Program:
 - Virginia byways
 - Scenic roads

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- Wineries/Vineyards
- Historical/cultural attractions
- National historic sites, monuments and cemeteries
- Civil War Battlefield parks and sites
- Recreational trails

• Acquisition of Historic Battlefields

- Virginia Civil War Trails
 - Updating Virginia Civil War Trails Maps
 - Installing interpretive markers at welcome centers/rest areas

Distribution of Allocations

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Summary of Proposed Modifications to CTB Policy

Allocation Distribution

- \$4 M set aside for high priority statewide initiatives
- 75% remaining funds provided to District members split equally between 9 members
- 25% remaining used by at large CTB members
- Suggest focus for At-large allocations

Eligible Categories –Keep all 12 Eligible Categories instead of limiting starting in FY13

Deallocation Process -Formally approve deallocation process and clarify extension approval

Note: Provision to only accept applications for existing projects was only in effect for this year (FY12)
