

Win-Fred MPO

Winchester-Frederick County MPO Boundary



- Established in 2002
- Localities:
 - City of Winchester
 - Urbanized portions of Frederick County
 - Town of Stephens City
- Based on population density
- May change after the 2010 Census



Location

- Northernmost point in Virginia
- Situated along I-81, seven miles north of I-66 interchange
- Approximately 50 miles west of Dulles International Airport



Metro Region

The Winchester/Frederick County metropolitan area is the economic, educational, and cultural hub of the Northern Shenandoah Valley



Demographics

Population Growth and Density

Winchester/Frederick County Population (2000): 82,700

Winchester/Frederick County Population (2010): 104,000

Northern Shenandoah Valley Population (2010): 225,000

MPO area: 103 square miles (650 persons/sq. mile)

Northern Shenandoah Valley area: 1600 square miles (140 persons/square mile)

MPO Administration

- Three Committees meet monthly
 - Policy Board (governing body)
 - Technical Advisory Committee
 - Citizens Advisory Committee
- Major projects overseen by Project Steering Committee
- Administered by Northern Shenandoah Valley Regional Commission



Transportation System Management

Supply Management

- System preservation (e.g. access management)
- Safety improvements
- Alternative infrastructure (e.g. roundabouts)
- System investments (e.g. completion of Route 37)

Demand Management

- Expanded local transit options
- Long distance commuter assistance programs
- Expanded employment opportunities



Priority Projects

- 2035 Long Range Transportation Plan
 - Currently being updated with a slated Fall 2010 adoption
- Route 37 (Shady Elm) Phases I and II
 - Phase II alternatives still under review
- Route 7 Corridor Study
 - Completed in February 2010
- Route 11 Corridor Study
 - Presentation of findings and recommendations recently conducted
 - Draft report to be presented in July
- Route 522 Corridor Study (joint effort with Rural Region)
 - Recent presentation of draft report to MPO
- City and Countywide Transit Services Plan
 - Completed in August 2009



2035 LRTP

- Principal planning responsibility for MPO
- Required by federal law
- Regional prioritization of transportation priorities
- Local stakeholder input
- Ensures planning and programming coordination with Commonwealth Transportation Board



Route 37/Shady Elm

- Evaluating alternatives to provide access to Shady Elm Road from Route 37
- Economic development benefits
- Transportation and land use challenges
- Need to improve accessibility, traffic flow, and safety while maintaining existing access to Route
 11




Route 37/Shady Elm






- East west arterial connecting Winchester metropolitan area to Northern Virginia
- Peak hour congestion issues
- Identified access management improvements and demand management options to preserve system capacity





- Critical north-south arterial parallel to I-81
- Contains urban, suburban, and rural segments
- Peak hour congestion and safety issues
- Study conducted by VDOT TMPD
- Currently evaluating access management options
- Examining alternative solutions (e.g. roundabouts)






- Major north-south arterial
- Joint study between Win-Fred MPO and NSVRC to evaluate access management and safety improvements from Winchester to Front Royal
- Corridor includes Virginia Inland Port and regional airport
- Currently seeking public input



U.S. Highway 522 From Pleasant Valley Rd to Front Royal, Virginia




Transit Services Plan

- Expansion of Winchester Transit (WinTran) to provide fixed route service to strategic locations in Frederick County
- Expansion of demand response transit services coordinated with existing public, private, and nonprofit providers
- Coordinate local and long-distance commuter infrastructure (e.g. transit service centers, park and ride lots, etc.)



System Investment Priorities

- Completion of Route
 37 bypass
- Replacement of the I-81 exit 313 interchange
- Relocation of the I-81 exit 307 interchange
