Interstate 70 MPH Speed Limits – Status

HB 856 & SB 537 raised maximum *allowable* speed limit to 70 mph on interstates.

The Commissioner has the authority to approve or deny the speed limit study recommendations as per § 46.2-870.



- 1,119 miles of interstate
 - 89 miles of interstate already at 70 mph (38 mi of I-85 on 9/25/07; 24 mi of I-85 on 9/16/08; 27 mi of I-295 on 07/01/10)
 - 786 additional miles considered for increase
 - 597 miles recommended to be posted at 70 mph
 - 189 miles of those considered to remain 65 mph

Major urban areas excluded and where speed limit < 65 mph




VSP and local law enforcement review and input

Results and Next Steps

Minor upgrades of guardrail, rumble strips and signage planned over the next 12-18 months

597 miles of rural interstate being raised to 70 mph, to bring total to 686 miles posted at 70 mph

Implementation coordinated with Virginia State Police

Signs Posted in 6-8 weeks
