# Performance measures in this report help assess progress of the seven VTrans goals

- Safety and Security
- Maintenance and Preservation

# **Highlights**

#### Safety and Security

- Highway fatalities decreased to 756, lowest since 1966
- Seat belt usage (82.3%) highest usage recorded in Virginia's history

#### **Preservation and Maintenance**

- Average transit vehicle age (6.1 yrs) lower than national avg. (8.4 yrs)
  - Guideline 12 yrs
- 80% interstate and 76% primary pavements fair or better condition
  - Pavement target 82% fair or better

#### Mobility, Connectivity and Accessibility

- HOV usage increased in Northern Virginia and Hampton Roads
- 34% freight thru Port of Virginia moved by rail or barge 36% in 2008

# **Highlights (cont.)**

### **Environmental Stewardship**

- Mobile source emissions continue to decrease
- Wetlands were replaced faster than they were affected

### **Economic Vitality**

• Virginia's transportation sector contributed \$8.8 billion to the GSP

### **Transportation and Land Use**

- Daily VMT per capita decreased statewide, Northern Virginia down 1.5
- 6.8% of state workers teleworked

### **Program Delivery**

• 82% of VDOT projects completed on time and on budget – target 77%

## **Economic Vitality - Opportunities**

#### Measures –

- Transportation Sector's contribution to the GSP
- Number of workers employed by transportation sector
- Volume of freight shipped through the Port of VA
- Port of VA's share of the East Coast Ports shipments
- Number of enplanements at Air Carrier airports
- % of SWaM expenditures

### Governor's Plan –

- Omnibus Transportation Funding Plan
  - \$6.0B economic impact \$3.3B direct, \$1.2B indirect, \$1.5B induced supports 48,000 jobs
- Protect Commonwealth Transportation Fund from transfers to General Fund
- Creates the Virginia port volume increase tax credit
- Grants \$50 per container income tax credit for any company shipping cargo containers via barge or rail
