Highway Priorities for the Draft FY 2013-2018 SYIP Update

- Fund deficits on underway project phases
- Maximize use of federal funds to meet federal strategy
- Fund underway project phases as well as project phases that start in the current federal fiscal year FFY 2012
- Fund deficient bridges and paving projects
- Increase funding for preliminary engineering
- Support development of PPTAs
- Support the Governor's Initiative to move the Commonwealth's fleet to alternative domestic fuels \$4.0 million in CMAQ Terms
- Allocate funds consistent with how they will be obligated and expended
- Redirect inactive balances on projects

Proposed Highway Changes for the Draft FY 2013-2018 SYIP

- Includes the VTIB Loan for Dominion Blvd as local funds to the project in the amount of \$151.9 million
- Projects an increase in funding for the Revenue Sharing Program at \$150 to \$200 million per year. State funds from the Maintenance Program were moved to the Revenue Sharing Program and federal discretionary construction funds were moved to the Maintenance Program
- Continue suspension of state construction formula allocations due to lack of available state funds
- Use Federal Revenue to fund GARVEE bond debt service in the amount of \$407.8 million

Proposed Highway System Changes for the Draft FY 2013-2018 SYIP

- The Interstate Program net downward adjustment relates to the movement of federal construction funds to the Maintenance Program in the amount of \$553 million; and the transfer into the Interstate Program of the \$97 million in GARVEEs for the I-95 Project from the PPTA Initiatives GARVEE balance
- The increase in the Primary Program is summarized below:
 - The local funds for the Dominion Blvd project of \$151.9 million (VTIB Loan) and \$174.0 million in local toll bonds were added to the Primary Program
 - The addition of the Port Authority contribution to the Rt 460 Project in the amount of \$250.0 million
 - Funding from our Private Partners were added to the Midtown Project in the amount of \$322.7 million
 - The movement of funding for the Rt 29 Bypass and Corridor Improvements from the Other Category to the Primary System in the amount of \$230.0 million
 - \$90.0 million of CPR Bond funds drop off in FY 2012 and no additional bond allocations are being added in FY 2018



Proposed Highway Changes for the Draft FY 2013-2018 SYIP

- The increase in the Federal Maintenance line item is related to the additional federal construction funding moved to maintenance and state funding being returned to the Revenue Sharing Program
- The Metropolitan Planning Organizations again this year programmed almost all 6 years of their RSTP and CMAQ funds
- The net decrease in the Safety, Rail, Enhancement and Other is the result of the \$0.7 billion in FY 2012 bonds dropping off and no additional bond allocations being added in FY 2018; and the increase in Revenue Sharing funding
