### March 2014 Overview

- □ Overall, the CTF is reporting annual revenue growth of 12.5 percent, 0.7 percent below the 13.2 percent growth rate in the revised December forecast
- □ Federal revenue collections remain strong, supporting program activities as expected
- □ Responding to winter weather continues to be a major focus. The recent extreme weather events has had a significant financial impact on the Maintenance Program. VDOT recommends revision to Annual Budget for CTB consideration to help cover costs.



# Commonwealth Transportation Fund State Revenue Collections March 2014

- Motor Fuels tax collections are performing better than anticipated, down 21.2 percent versus the forecasted 27.8 percent
- ☐ Year-to-date, Motor Vehicle Sales and Use tax collections are6.7 percent below the forecasted growth rate of 38 percent
  - A 29.7 percent increase for the month when compared to March 2013
  - Year-to-date growth rate is 31.3 percent
- ☐ The transportation share of the State Retail Sales and Use Tax revenues has grown by 55.7 percent year-to-date
  - Significant growth produced by HB 2313
  - 5.1 percent below the forecasted annual growth rate of 60.8 percent

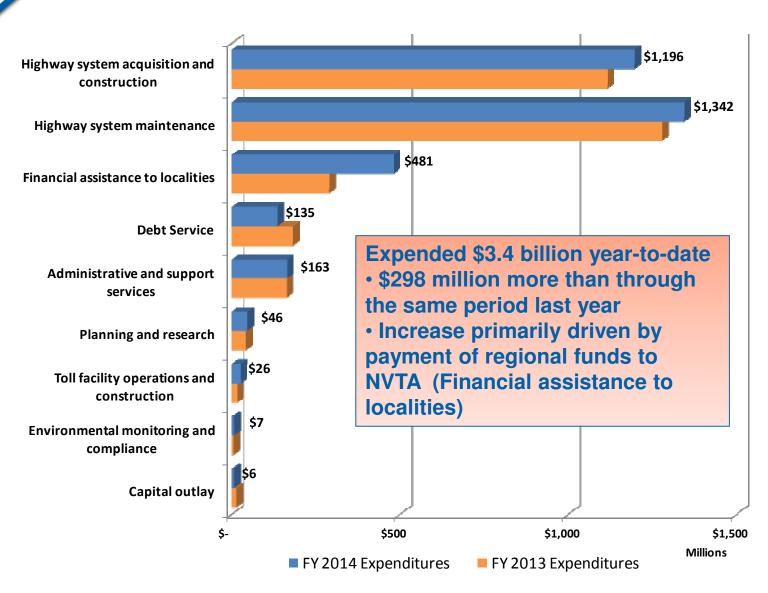


#### **VDOT Federal Revenue**

- ☐ Expended \$188.4 million in March, year-to-date total of \$1.34 billion
- ☐ Year-to-date spending is \$63.5 million more than the \$1.27 billion expended during the same period in FY 2013
- □ Current year allocations include carryover of \$97.5 million from FY 2013
- □ Snow related expenditures total \$289 million; budget is \$157 million
- ☐ Efforts are underway to address potential budget shortfall
