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Background

- Regional partnership between DC, MD and Northern Virginia jurisdictions since 1967
- DRPT provides support to the Northern Virginia jurisdictions that fund WMATA through NVTC
 - City of Alexandria, Arlington County, Fairfax County, City of Fairfax, City of Falls Church
- Along with DC and Maryland, Virginia also provides match to Federal PRIIA funding
- In FY14 the Commonwealth is providing \$156.7M in total funding for WMATA



Metro's Importance to Virginia

- Metro is critical to keeping Northern Virginia moving
- □ Over 400,000 trips on an average weekday in Virginia
- Metro carries 63% of all transit trips in Virginia
- Over 29 miles of Metrorail and 20 rail stations in Virginia
- □ 5 new Silver Line stations will provide 49,000 rides / day
- □ 45% of workers going to jobs in DC core and parts of Arlington use transit



Momentum Strategic Plan

- WMATA has developed the Momentum plan as the long-term investment plan for Metro
- Planned improvements needed to support future population and economic growth, expand system capacity, address overcrowding, and enhance system performance.
- Ensure that the Metro "spine" can handle the load of an expanded transit network, including the Silver Line
- "Metro 2025" includes 8-car train capacity, core capacity improvements and bus priority corridors



Virginia's Commitment to Momentum

- □ Governor McAuliffe has committed \$25M from the Commonwealth to support Momentum for FY15
 - DC and MD have also committed \$25M each
- Will be a shared commitment from the state and Northern VA jurisdictions
- DRPT will work with local jurisdictions to establish a common position on long-term funding
- New capital funding agreement among WMATA compact jurisdictions by spring 2015





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
