- Maximum allocation CTB may make to the Program is \$200M annually
- Maximum locality can apply for is \$10M
 - Up to \$5M of the \$10M a locality can apply for can be designated for maintenance projects
- Priority Tiers (changed based on HB1887)
 - Priority given to construction projects that have previously received Revenue Sharing funding
 - Next, priority given to construction projects that meet a transportation need identified in the Statewide Transportation Plan or projects that will be accelerated in a locality's capital plan
 - Next, priority given to projects that address deficient pavement resurfacing and bridge rehabilitation.



FY17 Formal Application Process

- Call for applications August 3, 2015
- Application deadline October 30, 2015
- 91 Localities submitted applications
 - 12 localities requested maximum \$10M
- Total requests \$218.4M

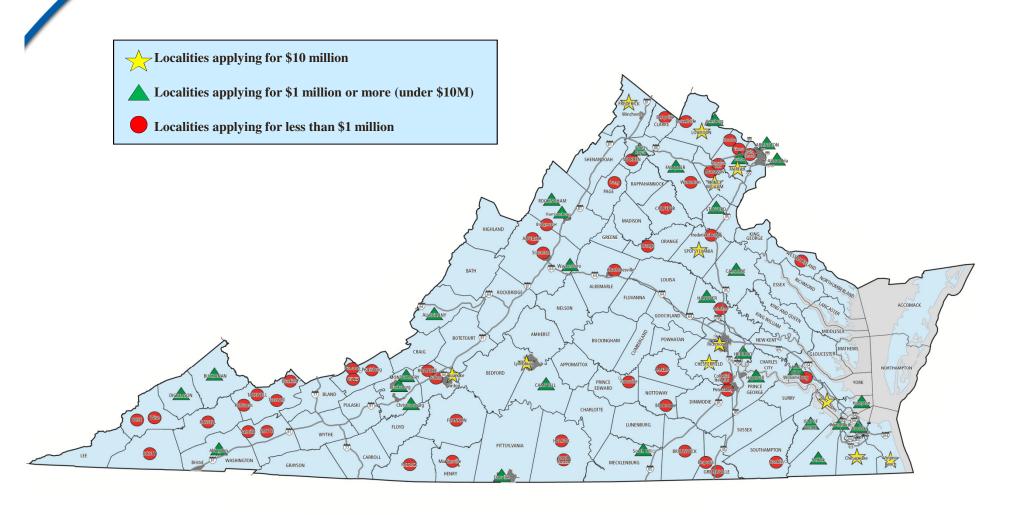

REVENUE SHARING DE-ALLOCATION

33.2-357 of the *Code of Virginia e*stablishes a timeframe for expenditure of the Revenue Sharing funds.

Legislation requires a project be initiated within one year of receiving allocations and if not initiated after two subsequent fiscal years allocations can be de-allocated.

Projects completed with allocations remaining that have not had any activity for 2 years will also be potential candidates for de-allocation.

De-allocation process was originally adopted as part of the Revenue Sharing Guidelines by the CTB in April 2011 and updated in July 2015.



REVENUE SHARING DE-ALLOCATION

- June 2015 Initiated review of 100 projects statewide as candidates for de-allocation
- July 2015 Preliminary lists provided to each District to review with the locality and provide an action plan
- October 2015 Lists finalized with Districts/Localities
- January 2016 Present proposed recommended de-allocation list to CTB for action
 - 26 Projects representing \$4.46M in state allocations
- De-allocated funds will be returned to Statewide Revenue Sharing account



REVENUE SHARING SUMMARY

• FY17 Requests: \$218,423,402

Current available allocation for FY17: \$154,463,239

(\$150M in budget and de-allocated funds)

Based on Current Prioritization & Available Allocations:

- Priority 1 projects = \$92,778,626 Fund at 100%
- Priority 2 projects = \$104,719,700 Fund 1st \$1M @100% then at 30.8%
- Priority 3 projects = \$16,563,450 Fund at 0%
- Priority 4 projects = \$4,361,626 Fund at 0%
