RESOLUTION OF THE COMMONWEALTH TRANSPORTATION BOARD

<u>Title: Proposed Limited Access Control Change (LACC)</u> <u>Route 23 (Orby Cantrell Highway), County of Wise</u>

WHEREAS, Route 23 (Orby Cantrell Highway), State Highway Project 0023-097-110, RW-201, in Wise County was designated as a Limited Access Highway by the State Highway Commission, predecessor to the Commonwealth Transportation Board (CTB), on May 11, 1967; and

WHEREAS, in connection with Route 23, State Highway Project 0023-097-110, RW-201, the Commonwealth acquired limited access control easements from Glamorgan Coal Land Corporation, a Virginia corporation, by Deed dated September 8, 1967, recorded in Deed Book 411, Page 417, recorded in the Office of the Clerk of the Circuit Court of the County of Wise; and

WHEREAS, Childers Oil Company is requesting a break of the limited access control on Route 23 in order to construct a right in and right out entrance on the southernmost portion of its property located at the intersection of West Main Street and Indian Creek Mountain Road, and to accommodate traffic in the south bound lane of Route 23 that would relieve congestion at the intersection controlled by the Virginia Department of Transportation (VDOT) traffic signal; and

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- WHEREAS, the proposed break of approximately 80 feet, lies along the west existing right of way and limited access line of Route 23 (Orby Cantrell Highway), as shown on the plans for State Highway Project, 0023-097-107, RW-201, from a point opposite Station 345+00 (Route 23 construction centerline) to a point opposite approximate Station 345+80 (Route 23 construction centerline) for a connection to the southbound lane (SBL) of Route 23, with right in and right out only turning movements, with no median break or signalization, and the construction of a right turn taper along the southbound direction of Route 23; and
- **WHEREAS**, the Wise County Board of Supervisors, by resolution approved February 11, 2016, authorized the County Administrator to request VDOT to issue a permit for the construction of an entrance as requested by Childers Oil Company, which requires the proposed break in limited access control by the CTB; and,
- WHEREAS, VDOT's Bristol District has determined based upon a Traffic Impact Analysis, dated April 13, 2015, and revised July 27, 2015, October 2, 2015, and October 13, 2015, prepared by Mattern & Craig, that there will be no impact to the operation of the Route 23 right of way, and the said proposed Limited Access Control Change (LACC) is appropriate from a safety and traffic control standpoint; and
- **WHEREAS**, VDOT staff has determined there will be no adverse environmental impacts; and
- **WHEREAS,** public notices were posted in the *Coalfield Progress* newspaper, on March 18th and March 25th, 2016 and closed on April 2, 2016, with no comments received; and
- **WHEREAS**, all right of way, engineering, construction, and necessary safety improvements shall meet all VDOT standards and requirements; and
- **WHEREAS**, all costs of any engineering and construction or necessary safety improvements, will be borne by the requestor; and
- **WHEREAS**, the requestor will be required to obtain a Land Use Permit prior to any activity within the Route 23 limited access right of way; and
- **WHEREAS**, VDOT has determined that compensation in an amount satisfactory to the State Right of Way and Utilities Director shall be required for the LACC; and
- **WHEREAS,** the proposed LACC is in compliance with Title 24, Section 30, Chapter 401 of the Virginia Administrative Code.
- **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, in accordance and compliance with the provisions of § 33.2-401 of the *Code of Virginia*, the CTB hereby finds

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and concurs with the determinations made by VDOT, and approves the said LACC as set forth herein and subject to the above conditions.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the Commissioner of Highways is authorized to execute any and all documents necessary to implement such changes.

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CTB Decision Brief Proposed Limited Access Control Change (LACC) Route 23 (Orby Cantrell Highway), County of Wise

Limited Access Control Change

Issues: Childers Oil Company has requested a break in limited access control along Route 23 (Orby Cantrell Highway) in order to install a commercial driveway entrance for access to and from the planned development of a convenience market with fuel pumps, onto the existing limited access right of way of Route 23. The proposed 80-foot break lies along the west existing right of way and limited access line of Route 23, as shown on the plans for State Highway Project 0023-097-107, RW-201, from a point opposite Station 345+00 (Route 23 construction centerline) to a point opposite approximate Station 345+80 (Route 23 construction centerline) for a connection to the southbound lane (SBL) of Route 23, with right in and right out only turning movements, with no median break or signalization, and the construction of a right turn taper along the southbound direction of Route 23. Pursuant to §33.2-401 of the *Code of Virginia*, and Title 24, Section 30, Chapter 401 of the Administrative Code of Virginia, the Commonwealth Transportation Board must approve the proposed break in the limited access control.

Facts:

- Wise County Board of Supervisors, by resolution approved February 11, 2016, authorized the County Administrator to request VDOT to issue a permit for the construction of an entrance onto the existing limited access right of way of Route 23, which requires a proposed break in limited access control to be approved by the Commonwealth Transportation Board (CTB).
- The Bristol District has determined based upon a Traffic Impact Analysis, dated April 13, 2015, revised July 27, 2015, revised October 2, 2015, and revised October 13, 2015, prepared by Mattern & Craig that there will be no impact to the operation of the Route 23 right of way and the said proposed Limited Access Control Change (LACC) is appropriate from a safety and traffic control standpoint.
- VDOT has determined that there will be no adverse environmental impacts associated with the proposed LACC.
- Public notices were posted in the *Coalfield Progress* newspaper, on March 18th and March 25th, 2016 and closed on April 2, 2016, with no comments received.
- All right of way, engineering, construction, and necessary safety improvements shall meet all VDOT standards and requirements.
- All costs of any engineering and construction or necessary safety improvements, will be borne by the requestor.
- The requestor will be required to obtain a Land Use Permit prior to any activity within the Route 23 limited access right of way.
- VDOT has determined that compensation in an amount satisfactory to the State Right of Way and Utilities Director shall be required for the limited access control changes.
- The LACC is in compliance with provisions of Title 24, Section 30, Chapter 401 of the Virginia Administrative Code.

Recommendation: VDOT recommends the approval of the proposed LACC as set forth in the resolution, subject to the referenced conditions and facts.






Result, if Approved: The Commissioner of Highways will be authorized to execute any and all documents needed to comply with this resolution.

RE: Letter of Support from Wise County Board of Supervisors for the Virginia Department of Transportation to issue the appropriate permit upon application of Childers Oil Company, to allow for the construction of a "right in" -"right out" ingress/egress on the southernmost portion of property along US 23 where Childers Oil Company wishes to build a new modem convenience store, fueling stations and generic Welcome Center at the intersection of Wise West Main and Indian Creek Mountain Road in Wise County, Virginia

Dear Mr. Buston:

The Wise County Board of Supervisors met at a regular scheduled meeting of the Board on Thursday, February 11,2016 at which time the Board authorized me, as County Administrator, to write a Letter of Support as follows and as referenced above. Childers Oil Company plans to build a new and modem convenience store with fueling stations offering eight multi-product dispensers and three truck product dispensers and also contain within the convenience store, casual dining and a generic Welcome Center. This new and modem store is needed so badly because many of the convenience stores in the County are renovated buildings; small and not convenient for ingress/egress. There are a few modem stores located on US 23 or US 58, but most stores are as described above. None of the existing stores have the casual dining/meeting area component that is planned for this site.

The main ingress and egress for the property location will be controlled by a VDOT traffic signal, there remains a need for a secondary ingress/egress in the south-bound lane of US Route 23 in order to facilitate the flow of traffic into and exiting the proposed facility, and to enhance safety for motorists on US Route 23. The company proposes to construct a "right-in" and "right-out" ingress/egress on the southern-most portion of the property to accommodate traffic in the south-bound lane of US Route 23 that would also relieve potential congestion at the intersection controlled by the VDOT traffic signal.

The Wise County Industrial Development Authority envisions this project as an asset that could potentially create additional development in that immediate area, and fully embraces the development of this project. The Wise County Board of Supervisors requests the Virginia Department of Transportation to issue the appropriate permit, upon application of Childers Oil Company, to allow for the construction of a "right-in"- "right-out" ingress/egress on the southern-most portion of the property to further enhance the development of this project in WISC County.

PROPOSED BREAK IN LIMITED ACCESS

Route 23 in Wise County, VA

Childers Oil Co. of Whitesville, KY proposes to construct a convenience store with gasoline and diesel pumps in the southwest quadrant of the signalized intersection of Route 23 and Indian Creek Road in Wise County, VA.

The approved Traffic Impact Analysis included a primary full access entrance on Indian Creek Road and a secondary right-in/right-out only entrance on southbound Route 23. (See attached site Exhibit A) The break in limited access is being requested to construct the right-in/right-out entrance on Route 23. In this location Route 23 is a four-lane divided highway with standard shoulder and ditch typical section. The speed limit is 55 mph. No median crossover is proposed for this entrance.

An Access Management Exception Request has been approved for the spacing between the signalized intersection and the proposed secondary entrance on Route 23. Acceleration and deceleration lanes will be provided at the entrance. The entrance will be a minimum of 30 feet of paved surface with proper shoulders and ditches, requiring a break in the limited access line of approximately 50 feet after construction is complete to allow for routine maintenance. The entrance will be stop/yield controlled. No signalization will be provided.

The traffic utilizing the proposed entrance in the design year (2022) is anticipated to be 34 vph in and 62 vph out in the AM peak hour and 29 vph in and 53 vph out in the PM peak hour. Between 6% and 9% of these vehicles are anticipated to be heavy vehicles.
