Concession Fee Project Eligibility

Multimodal Solutions - 495 to Haymarket

Projects must:

- Meet the requirements of Virginia Code (§ 33.2-1528 Concession Payment Account)
 - Programs or projects that are reasonably related to or benefit the users of the I-66 Express Lanes
 - Selected by the CTB after considering "the priorities of metropolitan planning organizations, planning district commissions, local governments, and transportation corridors".
- Be federally eligible (US Code of Federal Regulations, Title 23 § 129)

In addition, The Northern Virginia Transportation Authority (NVTA) required projects meet at least one of the overall Transform 66 project improvement goals

- Move more people
- Enhance transportation connectivity
- Improve transit service
- Reduce roadway congestion
- Increase travel options



Types of Projects

- Must be identified in studies and plans or projects in the region's constrained long range plan or regional transportation plans and be one of the following types of multimodal transportation improvements
 - Roadway improvements
 - Capital projects for new or enhanced local and commuter bus service, and transit priority improvements.
 - Expansion or enhancement of transportation demand strategies, including vanpool and carpool programs and assistance.
 - Capital improvements for expansion or enhancement of WMATA rail and bus service, and for improved access to Metrorail stations and Metro bus stops.
 - New or enhanced park and ride lots and access or improved access
 - Capital improvements for new or enhanced VRE facilities or services
 - Transportation Systems Management and operations



NVTA Project Selection Process

- June 8 NVTA issued a call for projects to member jurisdictions and agencies
- June 28 Received 26 applications totaling \$1.2 Billon from 7 jurisdictions/agencies
- July 7 NVTA's Planning and Programming Committee unanimously recommended 14 projects now totaling an estimated \$473.3 Million*
- July 13 NVTA selected 14 projects for consideration by the CTB

Concession Fee Project Categories

Multimodal Solutions - 495 to Haymarket

Roadway Projects:

- US 50 and Waples Mill Road intersection improvements
- Balls Ford Road widening from Groveton Road to Route 234 Business
- Route 234 at Balls Ford Road interchange including Balls Ford Road improvements
- Widen Jermantown Road Bridge to 4 lanes (VDOT, through 66 PPTA/EMP)
- Widen Monument Drive Bridge to add pedestrian facility (VDOT, through 66 PPTA/EMP)
- Widen Poplar Tree Road Bridge to 4 lanes (VDOT, through 66 PPTA/EMP)
- Expand I-66 Median Replace I-66 Bridge over US 29 (VDOT, through 66 PPTA/EMP)

Transit Improvement Projects:

- Commuter Parking Garage and Transit Station at Fairfax Corner
- East Falls Church Metrorail Station Bus Bay Expansion
- PRTC Western Bus Maintenance and Storage Facility
- VRE Manassas Line Capacity Expansion and real-time traveler information project

Pedestrian Improvement Projects:

- Nutley Street SW Mixed-use Trail from Marshall Road SW to Tapawingo Road SW
- George Snyder Trail from Route 123 to Route 50 at Draper Drive
- Lee Highway Sidewalk Improvements from Nutley Street to Vaden Drive



VDOT and NVTA Memorandum of Agreement

- NVTA Memorandum of Agreement (MOA)
 - Total funding is up to \$500 Million
 - Projects selected meet federal eligibility and Virginia Code
 - Projects planned to be completed by Toll Day 1 (December 2022)
 - Projects to be administered by VDOT, DRPT, local jurisdiction, or agency, using standard agreements
 - NVTA to select and recommend to CTB additional projects from available Concession Fee funds until \$500 Million is expended
- The CTB will
 - Review and approve project selections for inclusion in the Six Year Improvement Program
 - Authorize MOA between VDOT and NVTA
