<u>Title:</u> Authorization for the Commissioner of Highways to Enter into a Memorandum of Understanding with the Federal Highway Administration Concerning Tolling of the I-95 HOV/HOT Lanes, as Extended

**WHEREAS**, on July 31, 2012, pursuant to the Public Private Transportation Act of 1995 (Va. Code 33.2-1800 *et seq*), the Virginia Department of Transportation (the "Department") and 95 Express Lanes, LLC entered into a comprehensive agreement (the "Comprehensive Agreement"), relating to the I-95 HOV/HOT Lanes Project to develop, design, finance, construct, maintain, and operate 29 continuous miles of HOT lanes (or Express Lanes) on Interstates 95 and 395 (the "95 HOT or Express Lanes") in Virginia; and

**WHEREAS**, on June 27, 2012, the Department and United States Department of Transportation entered into an agreement ("Agreement") to permit tolls to be charged for the I-95 HOV/HOT Lanes Project; and

**WHEREAS**, the Department now desires to extend the 95 HOT/Express Lanes 2.2 miles to the south (the "I-95 Express Lanes Southern Terminus Extension") and eight miles to the north (the "I-395 Express Lanes Northern Extension) collectively, the I-95/395 HOV/HOT Lanes Project; and

**WHEREAS**, the Federal Highway Administration ("FHWA") requires the Department to enter into a tolling memorandum of understanding (Tolling MOU) collectively governing tolling for the existing I-95 HOT/Express Lanes and the I-95/395 HOV/HOT Lanes Project; and

**WHEREAS**, a Tolling MOU would require the Department to comply with mandatory federal requirements that apply to tolling of the I-95/395 HOT Lanes; and

WHEREAS, this Tolling MOU will replace the Agreement signed on June 27, 2012; and

**WHEREAS**, the Commonwealth Transportation Board ("CTB") is authorized under Va. Code §33.2-221(A) to enter into contracts and agreements with the United States government.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:** that the CTB hereby authorizes the Commissioner of Highways to execute a Tolling MOU between the Department and FHWA, governing the tolling of the 95/395 HOT Lanes, to include existing 95 HOT/Express Lanes as well the I-95 Express Lanes Southern Terminus Extension and I-395 Express Lanes Northern Extension, as set out in Attachment A, with such changes as the Commissioner deems necessary or appropriate.

#### CTB Decision Brief

Authorization for the Commissioner of Highways to Enter into a Memorandum of Understanding with the Federal Highway Administration Concerning Tolling of the I-95/395 HOV/HOT Lanes, as Extended

**Issue:** In order to adjust tolling for the I-95 HOV/HOT Lanes, as will be modified by extending the 95 HOT lanes to the south beyond the existing southern terminus and to the North, on I-395, beyond the existing northern terminus, a Memorandum of Understanding with the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) concerning tolling for the project (Tolling MOU) must be executed. Pursuant to Va. Code §33.2-221 (A) the Commonwealth Transportation Board (CTB) has the power and duty to enter into contracts and agreements with the U.S. government. Accordingly, approval of, and authorization for the Commissioner of Highways to execute, the Tolling MOU with FHWA is sought.

#### **Facts:**

- On July 31, 2012, pursuant to the Public Private Transportation Act of 1995 (Va. Code 33.2-1800 *et seq.*) the Virginia Department of Transportation (the "Department") and 95 Express Lanes, LLC entered into a comprehensive agreement (the "Comprehensive Agreement"), relating to the I-95 HOV/HOT Lanes Project to develop, design, finance, construct, maintain, and operate 29 continuous miles of HOT (or Express) lanes on Interstates 95 and 395 (the "95 HOT or Express Lanes") in Virginia.
- On June 27, 2012, the Department and United States Department of Transportation entered into an agreement ("Agreement") to permit tolls to be charged on I-95 HOV/HOT Lanes Project.
- The Department seeks to extend the 95 HOT/Express Lanes 2.2 miles to the south (the "I-95 Express Lanes Southern Terminus Extension") and approximately eight miles to the north (the "I-395 Express Lanes Northern Extension").
- The FHWA requires the Department to enter into a tolling memorandum of understanding governing tolling on the 95/395 HOT Lanes, including both existing I-95 HOT/Express lanes as well as the I-95 Express Lanes Southern Terminus Extension and I-395 Express Lanes Northern Extension. The Tolling MOU requires the Department to comply with mandatory federal requirements that apply to tolling of the 95/395 HOT/Express Lanes.
- The Tolling MOU (attachment A) will replace the Agreement signed on June 27, 2012.

**Recommendation:** That the CTB approve and authorize the Commissioner to execute a Tolling MOU with FHWA/USDOT relating to tolling on I-95/395, as set out in Attachment A, with such changes as the Commissioner deems appropriate/necessary.

**Action Required by CTB:** Virginia Code § 33.2-221 (A) requires a majority vote of the CTB to approve, and authorize the Commissioner to execute, a Tolling MOU with FHWA/USDOT relating to tolling on I-95/395 as set out in Attachment A, with such changes as the Commissioner deems appropriate/necessary. The CTB will be presented with a resolution for a formal vote.

**Result, if Approved:** The Commissioner of Highways will be authorized to execute the Tolling MOU with FHWA/USDOT relating to tolling on I-95/395, with such changes as the Commissioner deems appropriate/necessary.

## MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (MOU) BETWEEN THE FHWA VIRGINIA DIVISION OFFICE (Division) AND THE VIRGINIA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION (VDOT)

WHEREAS, on June 27, 2012, the FHWA and VDOT entered into a tolling agreement pursuant to the provisions of Section 166 of title 23, United States Code, permitting VDOT to toll the high occupancy vehicle ("HOV") lanes facility on Interstate 95 from approximately two miles north of the Capital Beltway near Turkeycock Run, milepost 2.0, at the northern terminus, to Garrisonville Road (VA 610) near milepost 143.6 in Stafford County, at the southern terminus, including the Phase VIII HOV-only lanes and HOV connector ramps through the Springfield Interchange ("I-95 HOV/HOT Lanes Tolling Agreement"); and

WHEREAS, tolling agreements are no longer required under Section 129 of Title 23, United States Code, as amended by MAP-21 and the FAST Act; and

WHEREAS, VDOT desires to extend and expand the existing I-95 HOV/HOT Lanes network 2.2 miles south (to I-95 mile marker 142.5), and approximately eight miles north (to I-395 at the Washington D.C. line) (the entire span from mile marker 142.5 to the Washington D.C. line hereinafter referred to as the "Toll Project"):

- The I-395 Express Lanes Northern Extension ("NTE") will extend the I-95/395 HOT/Express Lanes approximately eight miles to the north from Turkeycock Run to the Washington D.C. line.
- The Southern Terminus Extension ("STE") will extend the existing HOV/HOT lanes approximately 2.2 miles from approximately mile marker 145 to approximately mile marker 142.5. The STE includes the creation of new northbound and southbound access points between the HOV/HOT Lanes and the general purpose lanes.
- After completion of the NTE and STE, the project limits of the I-95/395 HOT Lanes will be from the Washington D.C. line to approximately 0.9 miles south of the Garrisonville Road overpass, mile marker 142.5, including the Phase VIII HOV-only lanes and HOV connector ramps through the Springfield Interchange (hereinafter referred to as the "Toll Facility").
- The I-95 HOV/HOT Lanes Project, NTE and STE will collectively be referred to as I-95/395 HOV/HOT Lanes Project.

WHEREAS, VDOT desires to implement tolls using a congestion pricing toll strategy on the Toll Facility; and

WHEREAS, the FHWA and VDOT desire to enter into this MOU to reflect the mutual understanding that 23 U.S.C. 129(a) and 23 U.S.C. 166, HOV to HOT conversion applies to the Toll Project; and

WHEREAS, 23 U.S.C. 166(b)(4), as amended by the FAST Act, provides that a public authority may allow vehicles not otherwise exempt pursuant to 23 U.S.C. 166(b) to use a HOV facility by paying a toll.

NOW THEREFORE, the FHWA and VDOT hereby agree as follows:

- 1. The Toll Project meets the toll eligibility requirements of 23 U.S.C. 166.
- 2. VDOT shall comply with all requirements of 23 U.S.C. 129(a) and 23 U.S.C. 166, as amended by the FAST Act, with respect to the Toll Project and the operation of the Toll Facility. VDOT shall also ensure compliance with these requirements through appropriate contractual arrangements with a private operator of the Toll Facility.
- 3. The I-95 HOV/HOT Lanes Tolling Agreement is hereby terminated and replaced with this MOU.

IN WITNESS THEREOF, the parties hereto have caused this MOU to be duly executed, on the date of the last signature below.

## <u>Title: Designation of the I-95 Express Lanes Southern Terminus Extension and the</u> <u>I-395 Express Lanes Northern Extension as HOT Lanes</u>

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to the Public-Private Transportation Act of 1995 ("PPTA"), (*Code of Virginia* §§33.2-1800 *et seq.*), the Virginia Department of Transportation (the "Department" or "VDOT") is granted the authority to allow private entities to develop and/or operate qualifying transportation facilities; and

WHEREAS, on July 31, 2012, pursuant to the PPTA, the Virginia Department of Transportation (the "Department") and 95 Express Lanes, LLC entered into a comprehensive agreement, relating to the I-95 HOV/HOT Lanes Project to develop, design, finance, construct, maintain, and operate 29 continuous miles of HOT lanes on Interstates 95 and 395 (the "95 HOT Lanes") in Virginia (the "Comprehensive Agreement"); and

**WHEREAS**, section 33.2-502 of the *Code of Virginia* provides that the Commonwealth Transportation Board (CTB) may designate one or more lanes of any highway including lanes previously classified as HOV lanes, in the Interstate System, primary state highway system, or National Highway System, or any portion thereof, as HOT lanes; and

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to section 33.2-502, in making HOT lanes designations, the CTB is required to also specify the high-occupancy requirement and conditions for use of such HOT lanes or may authorize the Commissioner of Highways to make such determination consistent with the terms of a comprehensive agreement executed pursuant to § 33.2-1808, however, the high-occupancy requirement for a HOT lanes facility constructed or operated as a result of the PPTA shall not be less than three; and

**WHEREAS**, by Resolution dated September 17, 2014 the CTB designated certain lanes that run from approximately two miles north of the Capital Beltway near Turkeycock Run, milepost 2.0 on Interstate 395, at the northern terminus, to Garrisonville Road (VA Route 610) near milepost 143.6 on Interstate 95 at the southern terminus as HOT Lanes; and

**WHEREAS**, on May 2, 2016, the Department entered into an amendment (the "First Amendment") to the Comprehensive Agreement to extend the 95 HOT Lanes south 2.2 miles by constructing one reversible HOT lane and adding new HOT lane access points (the "I-95 Express Lanes Southern Terminus Extension"); and

WHEREAS, the Department anticipates amending the Comprehensive Agreement to convert the existing I-395 HOV lanes to HOT Lanes from Turkeycock Run to the Washington D.C. line for a distance of approximately eight miles, and to construct one additional reversible lane which is intended to also be designated as a HOT lane within the current footprint of the reversible HOV lanes from Turkeycock Run to 0.5 miles south of Eads Street (the "I-395 Express Lanes Northern Extension"); and

**WHEREAS**, the Department intends for the I-395 Express Lanes Northern Extension, and the I-95 Express Lanes Southern Terminus Extension to be tolled using congestion pricing.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the CTB hereby designates the I-95 Express Lanes Southern Terminus Extension and the I-395 Express Lanes Northern Extension as HOT Lanes, in accordance with Va. Code §33.2-502, to be implemented upon issuance of a "Service Commencement Notice to Proceed" pursuant to the Comprehensive Agreement, as amended.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the CTB hereby specifies the high-occupancy requirement for the I-95 Express Lanes Southern Terminus Extension and the I-395 Express Lanes Northern Extension as HOV-3, in accordance with Va. Code §33.2-502, to be implemented upon issuance of a "Service Commencement Notice to Proceed" pursuant to the Comprehensive Agreement, as amended.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the CTB hereby authorizes the Commissioner of Highways to establish the conditions for use of the I-95 Express Lanes Southern Terminus

#### CTB Decision Brief

#### <u>Designation of the I-95 Express Lanes Southern Terminus Extension and the I-395 Express</u> Lanes Northern Extension as HOT Lanes

Issue: On May 2, 2016, the Virginia Department of Transportation ("VDOT") entered into an amendment (the "First Amendment") to the Comprehensive Agreement Relating to the I-95 HOV/HOT Lanes Project ("Comprehensive Agreement") to extend the 95 HOT Lanes south 2.2 miles by constructing one reversible HOT lane and adding new HOT lane access points (the "I-95 Express Lanes Southern Terminus Extension"). Furthermore, as contemplated under the Comprehensive Agreement, VDOT and 95 Express Lanes LLC are also engaged in efforts to develop and procure a project to convert the existing I-395 HOV lanes to HOT Lanes from Turkeycock Run to the Washington D.C. line for a distance of approximately eight miles, and to construct one additional reversible lane which is intended to also be designated as a HOT lane within the current footprint of the reversible HOV lanes from Turkeycock Run to 0.5 miles south of Eads Street (the "I-395 Express Lanes Northern Extension"). Pursuant to § 33.2-502 of the *Code of Virginia* VDOT is requesting that the Commonwealth Transportation Board designate the I-95 Express Lanes Southern Terminus Extension and the I-395 Express Lanes Northern Extension as HOT Lanes with a high occupancy requirement of 3.

#### Facts:

- On July 31, 2012, pursuant to the Public-Private Transportation Act of 1995 ("PPTA"), (*Code of Virginia* §§33.2-1800 *et seq.*), VDOT and 95 Express Lanes, LLC entered into the Comprehensive Agreement to develop, design, finance, construct, maintain, and operate 29 continuous miles of HOT lanes on Interstates 95 and 395 (the "95 HOT Lanes") in Virginia.
- Section 33.2-502 of the *Code of Virginia* provides that the Commonwealth Transportation Board (CTB) may designate one or more lanes of any highway including lanes previously classified as HOV lanes, in the Interstate System, primary state highway system, or National Highway System, or any portion thereof, as HOT lanes.
- Section 33.2-502 also provides that the CTB, in making HOT lanes designations, is required to specify the high-occupancy requirement and conditions for use of such HOT lanes or may authorize the Commissioner of Highways to make such determination consistent with the terms of a comprehensive agreement executed pursuant to § 33.2-1808, however, the high-occupancy requirement for a HOT lanes facility constructed or operated as a result of the PPTA shall not be less than three.
- By Resolution dated September 17, 2014 the CTB designated certain lanes that run from approximately two miles north of the Capital Beltway near Turkeycock Run, milepost 2.0 on Interstate 395, at the northern terminus, to Garrisonville Road (VA Route 610) near milepost 143.6 on Interstate 95 at the southern terminus as HOT Lanes; and

- The Department anticipates amending the Comprehensive Agreement to convert the existing I-395 HOV lanes to HOT Lanes from Turkeycock Run to the Washington D.C. line for a distance of approximately eight miles, and to construct one additional reversible lane which is intended to also be designated as a HOT lane within the current footprint of the reversible HOV lanes from Turkeycock Run to 0.5 miles south of Eads Street (the "I-395 Express Lanes Northern Extension").

- The Department intends for the I-395 Express Lanes Northern Extension, and the I-95 Express Lanes Southern Terminus Extension to be tolled using congestion pricing.
- In order for the I-395 Express Lanes Northern Extension and the I-95 Express Lanes Southern Terminus Extension to be operated as HOT Lanes, the CTB must designate the portions of the highway encompassed by the projects as HOT lanes.

**Recommendation:** that the CTB (1) designate the I-95 Express Lanes Southern Terminus Extension and the I-395 Express Lanes Northern Extension as HOT Lanes, in accordance with Va. Code §33.2-502, to be implemented upon issuance of a "Service Commencement Notice to Proceed" pursuant to the Comprehensive Agreement, as amended; (2) specify the high-occupancy requirement for the I-95 Express Lanes Southern Terminus Extension and the I-395 Express Lanes Northern Extension as HOV-3, in accordance with Va. Code §33.2-502, to be implemented upon issuance of a "Service Commencement Notice to Proceed" pursuant to the Comprehensive Agreement, as amended; and (3) authorize the Commissioner of Highways to establish the conditions for use of the I-95 Express Lanes Southern Terminus Extension and I-395 Express Lanes Northern Extension in accordance with the terms and conditions of the Comprehensive Agreement, as amended.

**Action Required by CTB:** Section 33.2-502 requires a majority vote of the CTB adopting or approving the recommended actions. The CTB will be presented with a resolution for a formal vote.

**Result, if Approved:** The I-95 Express Lanes Southern Terminus Extension and the I-395 Express Lanes Northern Extension as HOT Lanes, will be designated as HOT lanes with a high occupancy requirement of 3, in accordance with Va. Code §33.2-502, to be implemented upon issuance of a "Service Commencement Notice to Proceed" pursuant to the Comprehensive Agreement, as amended; and the Commissioner of Highways will be authorized to establish the conditions for use of the I-95 Express Lanes Southern Terminus Extension and I-395 Express Lanes Northern Extension in accordance with the terms and conditions of the Comprehensive Agreement, as amended.

<u>Title</u>: <u>Locality Land Conveyance, Route 610 (Briarfield Road), City of Hampton</u>

**WHEREAS**, Section 33.2-913 of the *Code of Virginia* allows the Commonwealth Transportation Board to transfer (convey) to the locality, upon petition of the said locality's governing body, real estate acquired incidental to the construction, reconstruction, alteration, maintenance or repair of the Secondary State Highway System, which constitutes a section of public road, and upon such transfer, such section of road shall cease, if required, being a part of the Secondary System of State Highways; and

**WHEREAS**, the City of Hampton has requested by resolution, the conveyance of the real estate for a portion of Route 610 (Briarfield Road), acquired as a part of Route 610, Project 0610-027-1421L; and





WHEREAS, a Design Public Hearing was held at the Double Tree Hotel Williamsburg, 50 Kingsmill Road, Williamsburg, VA 23185 on Thursday April 30, 2015, between 4:00 pm and 7:00 pm for the purpose of considering the proposed State Highway Project 0064-965-264, P101, R201, C501, B627, B628, B629, B630, B631, B632, B633, B634, B635, D603, D604, D605, D606, D607, D608 UPC 106665 ("64 Peninsula Widening – Segment II Project" or "Project"); and

**WHEREAS**, the proposed Project involves design and construction of one additional lane and full shoulder in each direction, with the widening occurring in the median of the existing Interstate 64 from 1.05 miles west of Route 199 (Humelsine Parkway/Marquis Center Parkway) to 0.54 miles east of Route 238 (Yorktown Road); and

**Issues:** The Interstate 64 in the Newport News area is congested. This project will improve capacity.

The proposed project, consisting of State Highway Project 0064-965-264, P101, R201, C501, B627, B628, B629, B630, B631, B632, B633, B634, B635, D603, D604, D605, D606, D607, D608; UPC 106665 ("I-64 Capacity Improvements Segment II" or "Project") will include the addition of one lane and full shoulder in each direction, with widening occurring in the median of the existing Interstate. Existing bridges within the corridor will be widened to the inside.

The project will require modification to the Limited Access Control Line along I-64, (Limited Access Control Change or LACC) in the City of Newport News and in York County, as proposed and noted in the attachment. Pursuant to §33.2-401, the Commonwealth Transportation Board (CTB) must approve this LACC and the Virginia Department of Transportation (VDOT) recommends that the CTB approve said LACC.

#### Facts:

- This change is not covered by the General Rules and Regulations of the CTB or by the Land Use Permit Regulations, thus requiring action by the CTB.
- The written determination of the Chief Engineer regarding this proposed project is attached for your consideration.
- A Design Public Hearing was held on Thursday April 30, 2015, between 4:00 pm and 7:00 pm at the Double Tree Hotel Williamsburg, 50 Kingsmill Road, Williamsburg, VA 23185.
- Proper notice was given in advance, and all those present were given a full opportunity to express their opinions and recommendations for or against the proposed Project as presented, and their statements being duly recorded in emails and comment sheets.
- The traffic analysis for the project was completed by VDOT and included in the December 2013 Interstate 64 Peninsula Study Environmental Impact Statement and the Traffic Technical Memorandum, dated December 2013.
- The Interchange and Mainline Operational Analysis was completed by VDOT for this segment of Interstate I-64 on the peninsula in the City of Newport News, York County and James City County, Virginia. This was completed March 9, 2015 and approved April 8, 2015.
- In cooperation with the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) VDOT has evaluated the I-64 corridor from the City of Richmond to the City of Hampton through the Interstate 64 Peninsula Study Environmental Impact Statement.

- The City of Newport News' City Manager has, by letter dated January 28, 2015, endorsed the Project and the proposed limited access control changes as presented by the Design Build Team.
- The County of York County Administrator has, by letter dated January 4, 2017, endorsed the Project and the proposed limited access control changes as presented by the Design Build Team.
- The Hampton Roads Transportation Planning Organization has endorsed this Project by resolution dated June 20, 2013.
- The FHWA has provided the requisite approval December 3, 2015, for the proposed LACCs based on the design of the Design Build Team.
- The Chief Engineer has determined that the proposed change will not adversely affect the safety or operation of the highways.
- This project is located in an area designated as attainment for air quality.
- The proposed LACC is in compliance with the polices and requirements of the CTB contained in Title 24, Agency 30, Chapter 401 of the *Virginia Administrative Code*.

**Recommendations:** It is recommended that, pursuant to §33.2-401 of the *Code of Virginia*, and policies of the CTB, that the I-64 corridor continue to be designated as a Limited Access Highway as described in the resolution and that the CTB approve, by resolution, the limited access right of way as modified by the LACC, developed by the Design Build Team. This action will modify the limited access line and right of way previously approved by the CTB's predecessor, the State Highway Commission, on October 4, 1956.

**Action Required by CTB:** Virginia Code § 33.2-401 requires a majority vote of the CTB to approve the recommended LACC. The CTB will be presented with a resolution for a formal vote to approve the limited access right of way modification, developed by the Design Build Team, and to provide the Commissioner of Highways the requisite authority to execute all documents necessary to implement the LACC.

**Result, if Approved:** The Commissioner of Highways will be authorized to execute any and all documents needed to comply with the resolution, and the I-64 Capacity Improvement Project will move forward.

**Options:** Approve, Deny, or Defer.

**Public Comments/Reactions:** There were approximately sixty-three (63) citizens in attendance at the public hearing and twenty (20) submitted written comments during the meeting. There were also three (3) email comments submitted to VDOT. A brief analysis of the responses indicates that the majority eleven (11) of those commenting on the plans are in favor of the project; nine (9) supported the project with recommended changes, two (2) were not in favor of the project.

**WHEREAS**, the Board is being presented a list of the transfers exceeding the established thresholds attached to this resolution and agrees that the transfers are appropriate.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED,** by the Commonwealth Transportation Board, that the attached list of transfer requests exceeding the established thresholds is approved and the specified funds shall be transferred to the recipient project(s) as set forth in the attached list to meet the Board's statutory requirements and policy goals.

# FY2017-2022 Six-Year Improvement Program Transfers For December 13, 2016 through January 25, 2017

**Issue:** Each year the Commonwealth Transportation Board (CTB) must adopt a Six-Year Improvement Program (Program) in accordance with statutes and federal regulations. Throughout the year, it may become necessary to transfer funds between projects to have allocations available to continue and/or initiate projects and programs adopted in the Program.

**Facts:** On June 14, 2016, the CTB granted authority to the Commissioner of Highways (Commissioner), or his designee, to make transfers of allocations programmed to projects in the approved Six-Year Improvement Program of projects and programs for Fiscal Years 2017 through 2022 to release funds no longer needed for the delivery of the projects and to provide additional allocations to support the delivery of eligible projects in the approved Six-Year Improvement Program of projects and programs for Fiscal Years 2017 through 2022 consistent with Commonwealth Transportation Board priorities for programming funds, federal/state eligibility requirements, and according to the following thresholds based on the recipient project:

Total Cost Estimate	Threshold
<\$5 million	up to a 20% increase in total allocations
\$5 million to \$10 million	up to a \$1 million increase in total allocations
>\$10 million	up to a 10% increase in total allocations up to a
	maximum of \$5 million increase in total allocations

In addition, the CTB resolved that the Commissioner should bring requests for transfers of allocations exceeding the established thresholds to the CTB on a monthly basis for its approval prior to taking any action to record or award such action.

The CTB will be presented with a resolution for formal vote to approve the transfer of funds exceeding the established thresholds. The list of transfers from <u>December 13, 2016 through January 25, 2017</u> is attached.

**Recommendations:** VDOT recommends the approval of the transfers exceeding the established thresholds from donor projects to projects that meet the CTB's statutory requirements and policy goals.

**Action Required by CTB:** The CTB will be presented with a resolution for a formal vote to adopt changes to the Program for Fiscal Years 2017 – 2022 that include transfers of allocated funds exceeding the established thresholds from donor projects to projects that meet the CTB's statutory requirements and policy goals.

**Result, if Approved**: If approved, the funds will be transferred from the donor projects to projects that meet the CTB's statutory requirements and policy goals.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED,** by the Commonwealth Transportation Board, hereby approves the allocations for locally-owned bridges from the State of Good Repair Program as set forth in Attachment C.

#### **CTB Decision Brief**

#### Approval of State of Good Repair Program Allocations to Locally-Owned Bridges

**Issue:** Pursuant to § 33.2-369 of the *Code of Virginia*, the Commonwealth Transportation Board (the Board) shall use properly allocated funds for state of good repair purposes (defined as "improvement of structurally deficient bridges") (State of Good Repair Funds) for reconstruction and replacement of structurally deficient state and locally owned bridges.

**Facts:** Section 33.2-369 allows the Commonwealth Transportation Board to approve allocations from the State of Good Repair Program to locally-owned structurally deficient bridges in accordance with the State of Good Repair Prioritization Process Methodology.

**Recommendation:** As submitted to VDOT by the localities, VDOT proposes that the recommended State of Good Repair allocations for the locally-owned bridges that were developed utilizing the State of Good Repair Prioritization Process Methodology that was used to develop the project list and proposed allocations be approved and made by the Board for these projects identified on Attachment A.

**Action Required by CTB:** The Board will be presented with a resolution for a formal vote.

**Result, if Approved:** The localities will be able to use the allocated State of Good Repair funds to improve the condition of locally-owned structurally deficient structures. The localities will be able to proceed with the projects once they are notified funds are available.

**Options:** The Board may approve, reject or modify the recommendation.

WHEREAS, § 33.2-1509 of the *Code of Virginia* provides a fund to "...be expended by the Board for constructing, reconstructing, maintaining or improving access roads within localities to economic development sites on which manufacturing, processing, research and development facilities, distribution centers, regional service centers, corporate headquarters, or other establishments that also meet basic employer criteria as determined by the Virginia Economic Development Partnership in consultation with the Virginia Department of Small Business and Supplier Diversity will be built under firm contract or are already constructed ..." and, "in the event there is no such establishment or... firm contract, a locality may guarantee to the Board by bond or other acceptable device that such will occur and, should no establishment or airport acceptable to the Board be constructed or under firm contract within the time limits of the bond, such bond shall be forfeited."; and

**WHEREAS**, the Augusta County Board of Supervisors has, by appropriate resolution, requested Economic Development Access Program funds to serve eligible property within the development of Mill Place Commerce Park, off of Route 901 (Mill Place Parkway) and said access is estimated to cost approximately \$250,000; and


**WHEREAS**, it appears that this request falls within the intent of Section 33.2-1509 of the *Code of Virginia* and complies with the provisions of the Commonwealth Transportation Board's (CTB) policy on Economic Development Access.

**NOW**, **THEREFORE**, **BE IT RESOLVED**, that \$250,000 of the Economic Development, Airport and Rail Access Fund is allocated to provide adequate access to eligible property within Mill Place Commerce Park, located off of Route 901 (Mill Place Parkway), Project ECON-007-978, M501, contingent upon:

- 1. All right of way, environmental assessments and remediation, and utility adjustments being provided at no cost to the Commonwealth; and
- 2. Execution of an appropriate contractual agreement between the County of Augusta (LOCALITY) and the Virginia Department of Transportation (VDOT), to provide for the:
  - a. Design, administration, construction and maintenance of this project; and
  - b. Payment of all ineligible costs, and of any eligible costs in excess of this allocation, from sources other than those administered by VDOT; and
  - c. Provision by the LOCALITY of either i) documentation of a least \$1,250,000 of eligible capital outlay attributed to qualifying business on property served exclusively by this project, or ii) should documentation of capital outlay be insufficient, an appropriate bond or other acceptable surety device by the LOCALITY to VDOT, not to expire before March 16, 2022, without written permission of VDOT. Such surety device shall provide for reimbursement to VDOT of any expenses incurred by the Economic Development, Airport and Rail Access Fund for this project's construction not justified by the eligible capital outlay of establishments served by the project. If, by February 16, 2022, at least \$1,250,000 of eligible capital outlay on property served exclusively by this project has not been expended or committed by firm contract by a qualified establishment or establishments, then an amount equal to 20% of the eligible capital outlay of up to \$1,250,000 will be credited toward the project's Economic Development Access Program allocation utilized in the project's construction and the balance of the utilized allocation not justified by eligible capital outlay will be returned to VDOT and the Economic Development, Airport and Rail Access Fund. This surety may be released or reduced accordingly at an earlier date upon provision of documentation of eligible capital outlay by a qualified establishment, or establishments: and
- 3. Determination by VDOT of eligible capital outlay in accordance with current policy and procedures for administering the Economic Development Access Program.

#### <u>Economic Development Access – Augusta County</u> Mill Place Commerce Park

**Issue:** Pursuant to § 33.2-1509 of the *Code of Virginia* and the Economic Development Access Policy of the Commonwealth Transportation Board (CTB), the Augusta County Board of Supervisors has requested funds from the Economic Development Access (EDA) Program to assist in constructing road access to eligible property located within Mill Place Commerce Park. Allocation of the requested funds by the CTB is sought.

**Facts:** § 33.2-1509 of the *Code of Virginia* authorizes the CTB to expend funds set aside for constructing access roads to economic development sites on which certain establishments as prescribed by the *Code* or other establishments that meet the basic employer criteria as determined by the Virginia Economic Development Partnership in consultation with the Virginia Department of Small Business and Supplier Diversity will be built under firm contract or are already constructed. In the event there is no such establishment already constructed or construction of such establishment is not under firm contract, a locality may guarantee to the CTB by bond or other acceptable device that such will occur.

On December 7, 2016 the Commonwealth Transportation Board (CTB) adopted the Economic Development Access Fund Policy (CTB Policy) that sets forth certain criteria which must be met for projects to be eligible for such funding and directed the Commonwealth Transportation Commissioner (now Commissioner of Highways) to establish administrative procedures to administer to assure adherence to the CTB Policy and legislative requirements. The Commissioner established such administrative procedures in the Economic Development Access Program Guide (Guide) administered by the Local Assistance Division of the Virginia Department of Transportation (VDOT).

Augusta County plans to develop within its 400-acre Mill Place Commerce Park, located in Verona, off of Laurel Hill Road. The property does not have adequate, unrestricted access to a public road system. The County proposes to construct a new roadway extending from Route 901, and continuing eastward to the proposed entrance of the site development. Augusta County finalized plans with warehouse company InterChange Group to build the 108,000 square-foot warehouse facility on a 7-acre parcel. Following the County's resolution in request of the project, InterChange Group finalized its negotiations with Sumitomo Drive Technologies which plans to lease a 72,000 new gear assembly facility on the subject 7-acre site. Augusta County will administer design and construction of the proposed access road project.

The proposed access road is planned to provide for a 26-foot wide asphalt roadway with curb and gutter and sidewalks within a 50-foot right of way, extending from Route 901 (Mill Place Parkway) and continuing east approximately 0.15 mile in length to provide appropriate and adequate access to the planned operation's entrance. VDOT District staff recommends the project and have estimated project costs for eligible items and quantities to be \$250,000. Augusta County will be responsible for financial arrangements to provide for all project costs exceeding the state EDA Program allocation. Documentation of qualifying capital investments of \$1,250,000 or receipt of appropriate bonding from the County will be required.

**Recommendations:** VDOT recommends that the maximum allocation of \$250,000 from the Economic Development, Airport and Rail Access Fund be approved for construction of this project, subject to certain contingencies as set forth in the accompanying resolution.

**Action Required by the CTB:** The *Code of Virginia* and the CTB's Economic Development Access Fund Policy specify that the CTB shall approve of the allocation of funds for the construction of the access road project. A resolution is provided for formal vote.

**Result, if Approved:** VDOT and the County of Dinwiddie will proceed with the Economic Development Access road project.

**Options:** Approve, Deny, or Defer.

WHEREAS, this property is expected to be the site of new private capital investment in land, building, and manufacturing equipment which will provide substantial employment; and

WHEREAS, the existing public road network does not provide for adequate access to this property and an access road improvement project is necessary and

WHEREAS, the County of Augusta hereby guarantees that the necessary environmental analysis, mitigation, fee simple right of way and utility relocations or adjustments, if necessary, for this project will be provided at no cost to the Economic Development, Airport and Rail Access Fund; and

WHEREAS, the County of Augusta acknowledges that no land disturbance activities may occur within the limits of the proposed access project prior to appropriate notification from the Department of Transportation; and

WHEREAS, the County of Augusta hereby guarantees that all ineligible project costs and all costs not justified by eligible capital outlay will be provided from sources other than those administered by the Virginia Department of Transportation.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Augusta County Board of Supervisors hereby requests that the Commonwealth Transportation Board provide Economic Development Access Program funding to provide an adequate road to this property; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Augusta County Board of Supervisors hereby agrees that the improvements so constructed will be added to and become a part of the secondary system of state highways and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Augusta County Board of Supervisors hereby agrees to provide advance funding for the project and will request reimbursement from the Virginia Department of Transportation when the project is completed.

**WHEREAS,** it is deemed that the administration of the Economic Development Access Program can best be served by the return of these separately approved allocations to the Economic Development, Airport and Rail Access Fund.

#### **CTB Decision Brief**

#### <u>Economic Development Access – Bland County</u> Bland County Industrial Park – De-allocation of Funds

**Issue:** Economic Development Access Program funds previously allocated provide access to the planned Bland County Industrial Park in Bland County is no longer needed because Bland County's plans for the development did not proceed as anticipated. The County has stated to the Virginia Department of Transportation (VDOT) that the previously planned and approved access road project is no longer required and therefore the funding will not be utilized.

**Facts:** Section 33.2-1509 of the *Code of Virginia* provides for the Commonwealth Transportation Board (CTB) to expend funds set aside for constructing access roads to economic development sites on which certain establishments as prescribed or other establishments that meet the basic employer criteria as determined by the Virginia Economic Development Partnership in consultation with the Virginia Department of Business Assistance will be built under firm contract or are already constructed.

The Bland County Board of Supervisors requested funding from the Economic Development Access Program to assist in providing road access to eligible property within Bland County Industrial Park. The access road project was neither constructed nor initiated, and no charges have been made against the project's Economic Development Access Program allocation.

**Recommendations:** VDOT staff recommends that Project ECON-010-822, M501 be cancelled and that the \$650,000 allocation for this project be returned to the Economic Development, Airport and Rail Access Fund in order that the funds may be made available for new projects.

**Action Required by the CTB:** The *Code of Virginia* and the CTB's Economic Development (formerly, Industrial) Access Policy specifies that the CTB shall approve the allocation of funds for the construction of access road projects. Having established the Bland County Industrial Park access road project and allocated funding by resolution, it is now recommended that the CTB rescind its original action for this project. The October 17, 2013 resolution is also attached for reference.

**Result, if Approved:** The \$650,000 total allocated to this project will be returned to the Economic Development, Airport and Rail Access Fund and made available for allocation to new projects.

**WHEREAS**, the Bland County Board of Supervisors has, by appropriate resolution, requested Economic Development Access Program funds to serve eligible property within the initial development of Bland County Industrial Park, off U. S. Highway 52 (North Scenic Highway), located north of the community of Bastian, and said access is estimated to cost approximately \$800,000; and

**WHEREAS**, it appears that this request falls within the intent of Section 33.1-221 of the *Code of Virginia* and complies with the provisions of the Commonwealth Transportation Board's (CTB) policy on Economic Development Access.

**NOW**, **THEREFORE**, **BE IT RESOLVED**, that \$650,000 (\$500,000 unmatched, \$150,000 matched) of the Economic Development, Airport and Rail Access Fund be allocated to provide adequate access to eligible property within the Bland County Industrial Park located off of U. S. Highway 52, Project ECON-010-822, M501, contingent upon:

- 1. All right of way, environmental assessments and remediation, and utility adjustments being provided at no cost to the Commonwealth; and
- 2. Execution of an appropriate contractual agreement between the County of Bland (LOCALITY) and the Virginia Department of Transportation (VDOT), to provide for the:
  - a. design, administration, construction and maintenance of this project; and
  - b. payment of all ineligible costs, and of any eligible costs in excess of this allocation, from sources other than those administered by VDOT; and
  - c. provision of an appropriate bond or other acceptable surety device by the LOCALITY to VDOT, not to expire before January 17, 2019, without written permission of VDOT. Such surety device shall provide for reimbursement to VDOT of any expenses incurred by the Economic Development, Airport and Rail Access Fund for this project's construction not justified by the eligible capital outlay of establishments served by the project. If, by October 17, 2018, at least \$3,250,000 of eligible capital outlay on parcels served exclusively by this project has not been expended or committed by firm contract by a qualified establishment or establishments, then an amount equal to 20% of the eligible capital outlay of up to \$3,250,000 will be credited toward the project's Economic Development Access Program allocation utilized in the project's construction and the balance of the utilized allocation not justified by eligible capital outlay will be returned to VDOT and the Economic Development, Airport and Rail Access Fund. This surety may be released or reduced accordingly at an earlier date upon provision of documentation of eligible capital outlay by a qualified establishment, or establishments; and
  - d. Provision of the required matching funds, up to \$150,000, by the LOCALITY for appropriately documented eligible project costs; and
- 3. Determination by VDOT of eligible capital outlay in accordance with current policy and procedures for administering the Economic Development Access Program.

WHEREAS, on June 13, 2016, the Commonwealth Transportation Board (Board) adopted a Fiscal Year 2017-2022 Six-Year Improvement Program (SYIP) pursuant to § 33.2-214(B) of the Code of Virginia (1950), as amended, that contained funding for capital projects to Central Shenandoah Planning District Commission (CSPDC), a Small Urban and Rural Transit Provider, for Fiscal Year 2017; and City of Harrisonburg Department of Public Transportation (HDPT), a Small Urban Transit Provider.

**WHEREAS**, the transfer of ownership of a transit facility located in Fishersville, Virginia, to CSPDC and the upgrade of an Intelligence Transportation System by HDPT were not appropriately funded in the Fiscal Year 2017 SYIP; and

**WHEREAS**, capital funding in the amount of \$233,844 in Fiscal Year 2017 is required to complete the transfer of ownership of the Fishersville, Virginia transit facility to CSPDC, and CSPDC had not previously applied for this funding; and

**WHEREAS,** HDPT requires an additional allocation of capital funding in the amount of \$392,222 in Fiscal Year 2017 to complete the upgrade of the HDPT ITS system.

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Board hereby approves the new allocation of capital funding to CSPDC, a Small Urban and Rural Transit Provider, in the amount of \$233,844; and an increase in a previous allocation to HDPT, a Small Urban Transit Provider, in the amount of \$392,222, and amends the Fiscal Year 2017-2022 SYIP to reflect these changes. These changes in allocation are contingent upon the recording of the allocated funding by CSPDT and HDPT in accordance with generally accepted accounting practices, reflecting that the allocation is for the purpose of providing for CSPDC and HDPT's transit services.

**Issue:** The Department of Rail and Public Transportation (DRPT) requests the approval of a modification to the Six-Year Improvement Program (SYIP) for Fiscal Years 2017-2022 to provide additional funding for Fiscal Year 2017 to the Central Shenandoah Planning District Commission (CSPDC) in the amount of \$233,844 and to the City of Harrisonburg Department of Public Transportation (HDPT) in the amount of \$392,222. Changes to the SYIP over \$200,000 must be approved by the Commonwealth Transportation Board (CTB) prior to allocation and award.

**Facts - CSPC:** CSPDC is currently the designated recipient for urbanized area transit funding to support public transportation in the Staunton-Augusta-Waynesboro urbanized area. As the local grantee, the CSPDC performs oversight for the program, while the service is managed and operated by Virginia Regional Transit (VRT), a private non-profit contractor. The rural area transit services have historically been operated through a direct grant agreement between DRPT and VRT. The rural transit services arrangement will expire at the end of Fiscal Year 2017, at which time the grant and transit responsibilities for rural area service will shift to CSPDC. VRT currently owns a transit facility in Fishersville, Virginia, and operates transit for both the urbanized and rural areas of Staunton-Augusta-Waynesboro from this facility. DRPT expects that ownership of the Fishersville facility will be transferred from VRT to CSPDC. DRPT concurs with and supports the transfer of the facility. DRPT expects that the transfer will occur on or about April 1, 2017, to insure a smooth transition and to avoid any disruption in transit service in the Staunton-Augusta-Waynesboro area.

The Fishersville facility was constructed in 2009 with Federal, State and Local funds at a cost of \$4,910,631. A local match of \$196,465 was provided by the local jurisdictions, private transit funding partners and VRT. The portion of local match provided by local jurisdictions is valued at \$66,465, and will convey with the property transfer. CSPDC agrees to pay VRT for its portion of the local match, \$130,000. Additional costs to be incurred by CSPDC are estimated at \$103,844 and include title insurance, closing fees, survey, environmental evaluation, facility inspections, condition report, recording costs and attorney fees. The total estimated cost for the transfer of ownership of the Fishersville facility from VRT to CSPDC is \$233,844.

As a result, CSPDC has requested \$233,844 of funding in Fiscal Year 2017 to complete the transfer of ownership of the Fishersville facility. CTB action is required in order to approve the allocation because the amount sought is beyond the authority of the Director of DRPT.

**Facts - HDPT:** HDPT is currently upgrading their Intelligent Transportation System (ITS) for their fixed route transit system. This will allow HDPT to become more efficient and continue to provide excellent service to the community, with the addition of Automatic Passenger Counters, Automatic Vehicle Locator, Interior Passenger Signs, and Real Time Arrival Information for passengers. This original project was budgeted for \$450,000 in the Fiscal Year 2017 SYIP. In

July 2016, HDPT issued a Request for Proposals for the upgrade of their ITS. The Request for Proposals resulted in six responsive bidders, all of whom exceeded the original cost estimate. HDPT selected the most qualified proposal and, following negotiations, arrived at a cost that was reasonable for the scope of work, but the budget for the approved bid was \$894,889

As a result, HDPT has requested \$392,222in additional allocations for Fiscal Year 2017 to complete the upgrade of their ITS system. CTB action is required in order to approve the additional allocation because the amount sought is beyond the authority of the Director of DRPT.

**Action Required by CTB: Recommendation:** DRPT recommends the approval of the additional allocations to the SYIP for Fiscal Year 2017 for CSPDC and HDPT.

**Action Required by CTB:** Approve allocations of \$233,844 to CSPDC for Fiscal Year 2017 in the SYIP for Fiscal Years 2017-2022, and approve additional allocations of \$392,222 to HDPT for Fiscal Year 2017 in the SYIP for Fiscal Years 2017-2022.
