

SMART SCALE PROJECT RE-EVALUATION

Sudley Road Northbound Widening Project in the City of Manassas (UPC 109293)

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CTB Policy

- A project that has been selected for funding must be rescored and the funding decision re-evaluated if there are significant changes to either the scope or cost of the project, such that the anticipated benefits relative to funding requested would have substantially changed
- If the project scope is increased, the applicant is responsible for the additional cost attributable to the increase in scope regardless of budget impact



Original Sudley Road Northbound Widening Project in the City of Manassas (UPC 109293)

- Selected for \$7.4 million in funding through the District Grant Program in the first round of the prioritization process, which fully funded the total project cost
- Scored 2.542 and ranked 15/45 in Northern Virginia
- Original project widens northbound Sudley Rd. (Rt. 234) from 2 to 3 lanes between Godwin Dr. and Dorsey Circle; adds pedestrian facilities, curb and gutter; and undergrounds utilities
- City requested a scope change to eliminate the underground utilities and extend the project limits using the savings




Proposed Sudley Road Northbound Widening Project in the City of Manassas (UPC 109293)

- Proposed revision extends left turn lane to Godwin Dr. (by about 200-ft) and extends the southern project limit by about 3,600 ft. to Grant Ave
 - Takes advantage of converting the existing continuous right turn lane to shared right-through between Dorsey Circle and Stonewall Rd.
 - Adds new pavement and sidewalk between Stonewall Rd. and Grant Ave.
 - Achieves a continuous 3-lane section between Godwin Drive and Grant Ave.
 - Adds a pedestrian cross-walk and push-button signal at SudleyRd./Rolling Rd.
 - Eliminates underground utilities

Recommendation

- Recommend approval of revised scope and continued use of currently programmed DGP funds based on the following
 - Application timeframe for Round 1 was compressed and the process was new, which resulted in some projects being submitted, and selected for funding, that may not have undergone the rigorous planning and validation process now required
 - Revised scope increased length of 3rd lane (for added transportation benefit) eliminates underground utilities
 - Revised scope has been qualitatively reviewed and no negative impact to project benefits is anticipated
 - City of Manassas has completed the public involvement process and all resulting comments have been addressed
 - City of Manassas agrees that the City will be responsible for any cost increase above the \$7.4 million in District Grant Program funds
