

### **Areas for Improvement - Review**

- Expand operational planning
- Improve interagency coordination
- Diversify and strengthen emergency public messaging
- Strengthen situational awareness
- Focus on continuous improvement

### **Enhancements incorporated to date**

- Expanded coordination
- Expanded strategic placement equipment
- Enhanced situational awareness
- Interstate closure plan
- Improved communications

### Improvements in development

- Innovative plowing and clearing techniques
- Refining the multi-agency interstate closure plan
- Refining internal and cross-agency emergency plans
- Enhancing awareness and understanding

### Improvements in development (continued)

- Improving highway overhead messaging
- Refining message content
- Deploy geo-fenced in-cab messaging to commercial vehicles
- Exploring expanded use of wireless emergency alerts (WEA)
