




Passenger Rail Service Development Plan

- 1. Introduces a framework for passenger rail planning
- 2. Assumes short-range and mid-range Investments and improvements from Transforming Rail in Virginia
- 3. Assumes long-range Investments and Improvements that were recommended in FRA plans
- 4. Additional corridors/improvements for long-range study and development
- 5. Feeds into FRA's Corridor Identification and Development Program, a pre-cursor to some BIL funding eligibility
