



## **Types of Cost Estimates**

# Designer's Estimate:

- < 75% complete PCES (feature cost)</li>
- > 75% complete TRNS\*PORT (unit cost)

## **Bid Estimate:**

- Completed plans- advertised
- VDOT's bid



#### **Bid Estimate**

- Based on Market Value
- Evaluate bids received for award or rejection
- Analyze bids for unbalancing
- Bid Estimate not subject to Freedom of Information Act. Highway Laws of Virginia in Chapter 43 (Virginia Public Procurement Act), article 2, section 2.2-4342



#### **Basis for Award**

#### To Low Bid:

 Bids below Bid Estimate by more than 25% and 25% below the 2<sup>nd</sup> bidder are noted for extended review and discussion with the contractor.

### To High Bid:

 If low bid is more than 7% above the Bid Estimate, the estimator investigates for justification to recommend award or reject.



#### **Bid Estimate Goal**

Determine current market value for project bid

Estimating is NOT an exact science. Contractor's bids typically have high to low range of 40%. Delete the high bidder - range often still exceeds 20%.
