





ROUTE 460 LOCATION STUDY

- CTB approved CBA-1 as the location for improvements to Route 460, November 2005
- CTB directed the Department to further study an alignment shift in Isle of Wight County
- As a result of additional study, a modification to this location approval is proposed.



- Initial alignment developed to minimize impacts to Isle of Wight County Agricultural Districts
- Revised alignment increases
 Agricultural District impacts, but
 decreases other impacts and cost







The shift reduces impacts to:

- Wetlands
- Streams
- Residences
- The shift increases impacts to:

- Agricultural Districts

Planning Corridor (500 feet)

- Two Corridors Studied in DEIS
- Planning Corridor for Location Decision
- Design Corridor for illustrative purposes

Design Corridor (variable width)

Impacts – Planning Corridor

Displacements	96	71
Perennial stream impacts (If)	20,406	19,002
Acres Agricultural District	23	44



Impacts – Design Corridor

	Approved CBA 1	With Alignment Shift
Acres Wetlands	138	129
Displacements	58	47
Perennial stream impacts (If)	11,529	10,932
Acres Agricultural District	10	20
