In other action today, the CTB approved 34 construction and maintenance projects worth \$57.5 million. The largest contract, \$18 million, was awarded to W-L Construction & Paving Inc., of Chilhowie, Virginia to build a new section of Route 58 in Lee and Wise counties. The project will replace an existing two-lane road with a four-lane divided highway. The five-mile section will stretch from east of Route 620 (near the top of the Winding Stairs Community) to the west end of the Big Stone Gap Bypass. The project is scheduled for completion in the summer of 2004. This project is among many to improve the Route 58 corridor across southern Virginia.

I-81 improvements in Salem region

The board approved a contract that will make further safety improvements to I-81 north of Salem. Allegheny Construction Company, Inc. of Roanoke, was awarded a \$1.5 million contract to extend the length of acceleration and deceleration lanes at three exits (150, 150B, 168 and the truck weigh scales) in Botetourt County. This project will provide a safer merging zone to allow traffic to exit I-81 without causing through traffic to slow down. The project is scheduled for completion in fall 2002.

The 17-member Commonwealth Transportation Board appointed by the Governor meets on the third Thursday of each month. The Board is primarily responsible for locating routes, approving construction contracts, creating traffic regulations, naming highways and administering and allocating the Transportation Trust Fund. Virginia Secretary of Transportation Shirley J. Ybarra is chairperson of the Board.

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
