Dear Members of the Board:

Enclosed for your review and consideration is the FY 2004 financial plan that outlines the revenues and allocations made by the Commonwealth Transportation Board. For FY 2004 the Board has funding available for allocation of \$3,656,586,566, an increase of \$239,922,286 from the FY 2003 budget approved last year. This document is also the Virginia Department of Transportation's recommended annual operating budget.

The state revenue estimates are the December 2002 official revenue estimate for the Highway Maintenance and Operating Fund, Transportation Trust Fund, and the Priority Transportation Fund. Also, the FY 2003 revenue adjustment included in that official estimate is included. Because state transportation revenues are currently lagging the estimate, a \$50 million budgetary reserve is recommended. Federal revenues are the official April 2003 federal estimates and reflect the signing of the federal FY 2003 appropriation bill.

The plan includes recommended allocations to the Mass Transit, Airport, and Port Funds totaling \$228.7 million. For the VDOT operating budget, highway maintenance, including amounts for city/county maintenance payments, totals \$1.1 billion. This represents a four percent increase. Construction program funding totals \$2.0 billion. Of the \$2.0 billion, \$940 million is allocated to the interstate, primary, secondary and urban systems.

















Commonwealth Transportation Funds Distribution






DISTRIBUTION OF HIGHWAY TRANSPORTATION TRUST FUND REVENUES FISCAL YEAR 2003 - 04









Footnotes

FOOTNOTES TO FY 04 VDOT ANNUAL BUDGET

- 1. The fiscal year 2003 amount includes a negative variance between the December 2002 official estimate and the April 2002 revenue estimate for fiscal year 2002. For fiscal year 2004, there is a positive variance. The amounts are detailed on page 19.
- 2. The unallocated balance is the reconciled amount of the actual undesignated revenues and expenditures versus the estimated undesignated revenues and allocations for the previously audited fiscal year.
- 3. The decrease reflects the change in appropriations by the General Assembly. In FY 2003, one-third of the estimated insurance premiums were appropriated to the Priority Transportation Fund in accordance with the Virginia Transportation Act of 2000.
- 4. Approportations from the Commonwealth's General Fund to offset the debt service costs related to the \$317 million of FRANs sold in fiscal year 2003 to replace VDOT's share of the Transportation Trust Fund's State Retail Sales and Use taxes.
- 5. The FY 03 amount included the \$317.0 million FRAN sale as well as the issuance of \$45.7 million of Northern Virginia Transportation District (NVTD) bonds. The amounts are detailed on page 24.
- 6. The variance reflects an increase in the WWB special federal funds and a general increase in federal apportionments and increased obligation authority as included in the April 2003 Federal apportionment tables. Amounts are detailed on pages 24 27.
- 7. The variance is mainly the result of increased federal estimated revenues.
- 8. Transfers to the Commonwealth's General Fund as required by the Chapter 1042 of the 2003 Virginia Acts of Assembly relating to budget reductions.
- 9. The budgetary reserve represents an uncommitted amount of estimated revenues held to offset possible revenue shortfalls in FY 03.
- 10. The positive variance is the change from the April 2002 revenue estimate and the December 2002 official revenue estimate for fiscal year 2004.
- 11. The respective fiscal year amounts reflect adjustments between the original and revised revenue estimates for the prior fiscal year.
- 12. The Code of Virginia, § 33.1-23.1, requires funding first be provided for Maintenance, Administrative, and General Expenses. The funding source for these activities is the Highway Maintenance and Operating Fund (HMOF). The HMOF estimated allocations exceed HMOF revenues therein requiring a transfer from Highway Construction Fund in the amounts listed.
- 13. Allocation is for the development of the Tourist Oriented Directional Signs (TODS) program that is funded from revenues generated by the LOGO program.

FOOTNOTES TO FY 04 VDOT ANNUAL BUDGET Cont'd

- 14. Specific funding for the Traffic Monitoring System was removed as part of the fiscal year 2003 budget reductions. Future funding for this item shall be included in the Maintenance program.
- 15. Funding requirements for Magnetic Levitation (MAGLEV) as approved by the 2002 Session of the General Assembly have been fulfilled.
- 16. Chapters 1019/1044 of the 2000 Acts of the Assembly (Virginia Transportation Act of 2000) requires collections above the official revenue forecast for the HMOF and TTF to be transferred to the Priority Transportation Fund (PTF). For fiscal year 2003, excess fiscal year 2002 revenues of \$50,321,000 in the HMOF and \$5,041,000 in the TTF were transferred to the PTF. The amount of the variance for fiscal year 2003 will not be known until year-end.
- 17. Because Federal FY 2003 is the last year of the Federal reauthorization, the FY 2004 amount is an estimate of future Federal earmarks.
- 18. Actual FEMA reimbursements from prior major emergency events.
- 19. FRAN debt service is allocated from the PTF off the top of the construction program.
- 20. Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality (CMAQ) Improvement funds and Surface Transportation Program (STP) Regional funds are allocated to specific projects prior to the adoption of the final budget.
- 21. Legislative action has brought Virginia in compliance with the repeat offender provisions of TEA-21.
- 22. The specific funding for State Police Highway Patrol Services required by Item 491 F.4. of Chapter 1042 of the Virginia Acts of Assembly are provided by the related project allocations as identified in the Six-Year Improvement Program.
- 23. No bond sales are planned for the Northern Virginia Transportation District program during FY 2004.
- 24. Reduction includes the elimination of funding for a new equipment division facility.
