VTrans2025

- Completed December 2004
- A blueprint for shaping transportation's future
- Foundation for both Governors Warner and Kaine's transportation initiatives
- VTrans2035 to build on and improve

VTrans2025 Recommendation – Invest More, Support Transit, Fund Rail, and Protect Revenues

- Governor Kaine proposed transportation initiatives during three regular and two special sessions of the General Assembly
- Governor Kaine proposed a constitutional amendment and significant statutory protections for transportation funds
- Transit and rail funding increased significantly
 - FY07-10 transit funding up \$255.2 million (47%) over FY03-06
 - Rail funding up \$182 million (495%) over FY03-06

VTrans2025 Recommendation – Invest More, Support Transit, Fund Rail, and Protect Revenues

Results cont'd

- Transportation Partnership Act of 2005 included \$848 million in one-time funding to eliminate all Six-year Program deficits and support a variety of innovative partnerships
- Dedicated Rail Fund created in 2005, earmarking approximately \$23 million/year to rail capital initiatives

VTrans2025 Recommendation – Strengthen Planning, Manage Access, and Address Transportation/Land Use Conflict

- A key goal of Governor Kaine was to reduce the disconnect between and improve the coordination of land use and planning
- Significant progress made through new laws that:
 - Require traffic impact analysis of major developments
 - Require high growth localities to establish Urban Development Areas
 - Expand the number of localities that can impose road impact fees
 - Require the CTB to develop new requirements for secondary street acceptance
 - Require VDOT to develop and implement access management standards
 - Require regional performance measures
 - Allow localities to transfer development rights
 - Expand Conditional Zoning authority

VTrans2025 Recommendation – Improve Connections, Think Multimodally, and Take the Lead

- The Heartland Rail Corridor Project will connect the Port of Virginia with the industrial heartland
- Planning is under way for a network of HOT/HOV lanes in Northern Virginia
- The Dulles Corridor Metrorail will provide seamless rail from the region's major activity centers to the region's international airport
- The 54-mile Virginia Capital Trail will connect Richmond to Williamsburg by bicycle

VTrans2025 Recommendation – Improve Connections, Think Multimodally, and Take the Lead

Results cont'd

- The Secretary appointed a Freight Advisory Committee
- Phrase 1 of the freight study was completed
- Norfolk Light Rail is under way
- "Recognize alternative modes" is a core policy goal of the CTB
- The Secretary executed an I-81 Memorandum of Understanding with 5 states for future planning

VTrans2025 Recommendation – Use Objective Criteria and Plan Multimodally

- Prioritization systems have been developed around VTrans2025 goals
- A transportation performance report developed around Vtrans2025 goals and performance measures was developed and is being updated

VTrans2025 Recommendation – Use Objective Criteria and Plan Multimodally

Results cont'd

- Concerted efforts are under way to integrate transit and highway plans into an integrated Surface Transportation Plan
- Representatives from three regional planning bodies and VAPDC were appointed to a VTrans technical committee to promote greater coordination of regional and state planning efforts – a key component in integrating transportation and land use

VTrans2025 Recommendation – Continue Public, Stakeholder, and Agency Involvement

- VTrans2035 will include extensive public involvement plan
- Agency heads are actively engaged in planning Vtrans2035
- Office of Intermodal Planning and Investment organized
- Website
- Monthly discussion topics for the Commonwealth Transportation Board

Context for VTrans2035

- Legislative mandate
- January 2008 Briefing
- *VTrans2025* is the base (tasks will not be repeated)
- *VTrans2035* is the overall policy document for prioritizing statewide transportation projects and programs for the next twenty years
- Constrained and unconstrained

Background – Legislative Requirements

- VA Code §33.1-23.03
 - Requires the CTB to develop a statewide multimodal long-range transportation plan
 - Plan must be updated at least every 5 years
- VA Code §2.2-229
 - Established the Office of Intermodal Planning and Investment (OIPI) in the Office of the Secretary
 - Requires OIPI to assist CTB with long-range plan

Background - Facts

- 2004 *VTrans2025* vision, goals and policy recommendations were adopted by CTB and other policy boards
- 2005 VTrans2025 methodology and estimates were validated by JLARC
- 2005 APA report indicated that "The Commonwealth Lacks a Coordinated Transportation Plan"

Secretary's Guidelines

- Integrate modal and regional plans
- Priorities should be developed irrespective of funding formulas
- Identify 10-12 achievable transportation investment priorities
- Address land use, economic development, climate change, freight needs and bridges
- Be pragmatic
- Be realistic
