2008 Legislative Session

- Ensure that progress from 2007 session and other recent accomplishments are maintained
 - Accountability
 - Transparency
 - Intermodalism
 - Partnership
 - Land use
 - Maintenance of Existing Infrastructure

2008 Legislative Session – HB 3202

- Implementation Team formed in May to lead effort
- Industry Work Group was formed to advise on policies and procedures and issues
- Website <u>www.hb3202.virginia.gov</u> contains all information
- Effort has been local, regional, and Commonwealth partnership

2008 Legislative Session – HB 3202

- HB 3202 (Chapter 896) implementation has progressed since its passage
 - Regional
 - NVTA will begin collection of revenues on January 1, 2008.
 Cooperative relationship between NVTA, localities and Commonwealth to facilitate success
 - HRTA has been formed; staffing and consultants are being hired; revenue collection scheduled to begin April 1, 2008. Expect legislative proposal to change regional taxes and fees
 - Statewide all procedures and revenue collection processes are in place
 - JLARC conducted interim review of abusive driver fees for Joint Commission on Transportation Accountability; found revenue estimate generally appropriate

Abusive Driver Fees

- Governor is committed to addressing the issue
- Already 6 bills have been pre-filed by legislators that call for the repeal of the fees
 - Do not provide substitute funding sources
- Fees account for more than \$300m in transportation revenues for the current six year financial plan

2008 Legislative Session

- Two new Transportation Committee Chairs
 - House: Delegate Joe May replaces Delegate Wardrup
 - Senate: Senator Yvonne Miller replaces Senator
 Williams
- Committee membership has not been determined
- New Senate Finance Staff

2008 Legislative Session

- Commonwealth Transportation Board will receive regular updates on substantive bills and financial issues throughout the session
