

## Preliminary Estimate: \$1.6 Billion\*

The new Long Bridge will increase capacity:

- Over 18,000 new freight and passenger train crossings
- 1 million trucks taken off the roads
- 5 million cars taken off the roads
- Safety improved by reducing crashes

## **Long Bridge Today**

- Two tracks operate at 98% capacity.
- More than 70 passenger, freight and commuter rail lines travel the Long Bridge bottleneck daily, creating slowdowns and stoppages that mean delays for passengers and freight haulers.
- Built in 1904 atop a structure that was constructed in 1808, the Long Bridge has been renovated only once, during World War II, when it was reinforced to carry heavy loads.
