STATE HIGHMY COMMISSION OF VIRGINIA RICHMOND, VIRGINIA APRIL 16, 1964

The State Highway Countesion of Virginia met at the Central Highway Office Building in Richmond, Va., on April 16, 1964, at 11 A.M. The chairman, Mr. D. B. Fugate, presided.

Present: Messre. Fugate, Chilton, Plythe, Holland, Landrith, Helson, Sciator and Weaver. Absent: Mr. Lawrence H. McWane.

In opening the meeting, the chairman remarked that some of the Commission numbers had attended the opening on the previous day of the Chesapeake Bay Bridge-Tunnel, which furnishes a seventeen-wile physical connection from Virginia's Eastern Shore to the mainland. He said it was an inspiration to ride across this bridge-tunnel system, which has a great potential for all of Virginia, and aspecially the Tidewater area.

Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Landrith, Seconded by Senator Melson, that WEMMAS, the Fairfax County Board of Supervisors has requested the Department to make the necessary surveys to determine if portions of Secondary Route 649 and Secondary Route 617 could logically be included in the State Primary System; and

WHEREAS, these studies have been completed, the results of which indicate definitely that neither of the subject routes has sufficient Primary characteristics to justify inclusion in the Primary System of highways;

NOW, THEMEFORE, BE IT MESOLVED, that the requests of the Board pertaining to the transfer of said Secondary routes to the Primary System are bereby denied. Motion carried.

In considering requests for transfer of secondary roads to the primary system, where such requests are prompted by the hope that they may be improved at an earlier date then would be possible with secondary system funds, the chairman suggested that citizens of comties wishing improvement in roads of this type would be well advised to seek the improvement through the resident engineers and the boards of supervisors, and through the county secondary funds, since the road in all probability would not qualify for improvement with primary funds for some time.

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Tentative allocations of Interestate and Eural Primary Gonatruction funds for 1964-65 were presented by Mr. J. E. Harwood, Director of Programming and Plansing. The chairman stated the Urban funds were not included in these allocations, since the Urban funds are apportioned to the cities and towns on the basis of population and this is being done by the Urban Division.

Mr. Harwood stated the tentative allocations for the Lynchburg District had been approved by the Counissioner for that district, who was absent from the meeting because of illness.

Motion was made by Mr. Flythe, seconded by Judge Weaver, that the tentative allocations be approved. Motion carried. Tabulation of these allocations is attached.

On motion of Judge Weaver, seconded by Mr. Holland, dates for public hearings on the above allocations were set for Thursday, May 28, 1964, at Rosnoks for the Sales, Bristol, Staunton and Lynchburg Districts; and Friday, May 29, 1964 at Richmond for the Richmond, Fredericksburg, Culpaper and Suffolk Districts.

The chairman stated the Commission had been considering for many months the location of Route 64 in Augusta, Melson and Albemaria Counties and had found it difficult to decide among the various alternates. He stated the Highway Department had employed engineering consultants to make the preliminary studies and that two public hearings had been held, that since the last public hearing, in December, 1963, the Commission had been studying the record of the hearings and the report of the consulting engineers. He presented Hr. A. K. Hunsberger, Location and Design Engineer, who emplained the various lines considered. On Motion of Hr. Sclater seconded by Mr. Flyths, the Commission adopted the following resolution:

WHEREAS, in accordance with the provisions of Section 128 of Title 23 - Bigineys, United States Gode, Public Bearings were held in the Anditorium of the McIntire School, Charlottesville, Va. at 10:30 A.M. on December 17, 1963, and in the Anditorium of the Augusta County Farm Sureau Evilding, Staunton, Va., at 10:30 A.M. on December 18, 1963, concerning the proposed construction of Interstate Route 64 from the intersection of Boute 81 (near Staunton) to the Albemaria-Fluyama County Line (near Shedwall) in Augusta, Helson, and Albemaria Counties, State Projects 0064-007-102, PS-101; 0064-062-101, PE-101, and 0064-002-102, PS-101, Pederal Projects I-64-2(1)53, and I-64-2-(1)52,

WHERAS, proper notice was given in edvance and all those present were given a full opportunity to express their opinions and recommendations for or against the proposed development as placed and their statements being duly recorded, and

WHEREAS, the accompain effects of the proposed relocation have been exemined and given proper consideration, and this evidence along with all other, has been excefully reviewed.

approved in accordance with the construction of this project be approved in accordance with the general plan as proposed and presented at the Public Rearing by the Department Engineers along Line C. This proposed Interstate development begins at an intersection with Interstate Boute 81, south of Route 250, near Staunton, passes to the south of Maynesboro, through Rockfish Gep, to the south of Charlottesville, and proceeds to a tie-in with the previously approved section of Interstate Route 64 at the Albanaria-Pluvanna County Line, north of Boute 250. Motion carried.
