WHEREAS, after several years of experience it is felt necessary that a revision be made in the policy established by the action of August 18, 1966.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that effective this date the policy adopted on August 18, 1966 is hereby rescinded in its entirety; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the following resolution is this day adopted as the new policy governing the allocation of recreational access funds:

WHEREAS, the 1866 session of the General Assembly amended the Code of Virginia by adding Section 33-136.3 to provide certain funds for the construction of access roads to public recreational areas and historical sites, and further authorized the State Highway Commissioner to construct, reconstruct, main tain, or improve such roads upon certain conditions:

WHEREAS, this act further provided that the Highway Commission and the Commission of Outdoor Recreation would cooperate in the selection and designation of the areas to be served by such roads:

WHEREAS, Section 33-136.3 of the Code of Virginia authorizes the State Highway Commission and the Commission of Outdoor Recreation to make certain regulations to carry out their part of the provisions of this section; and

WHEREAS, it is deemed advisable to establish and adopt certain policies relative to the use of recreational access funds:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the State Highway Commission and the Commission of Outdoor Recreation hereby adopt the following policy to govern the use of recreational access funds pursuant to Section 33-136.3 of the Code of Virginia:

- The use of recreational access funds shall be limited to the purpose of providing proper access to publicly developed recreational areas and historical sites where the full provisions of Section 33-186.3 have been complied with.
- 2. Recreational access funds shall not be used for the acquisition of right of way, except that when improvement is made to an existing road such funds may be used for the moving and restoration of fencing and for damages to buildings or other improvements, as it is the intent that these funds are to be used only for the actual construction and engineering of a road facility adequate to serve the traffic generated by the public recreational area or historical site.
- 3. In deciding whether or not to construct or improve any such recreational access road and in determining the nature of the road to be constructed, consideration will be given to the cost thereof in relation to the volume and nature of the traffic to be generated as a result of the development of the public recreational area or historical site, on the recreational benefits to be derived, and also on the type of protective zoning in effect.

- 4. Recreational access funds will not be considered for the construction, reconstruction, maintenance, or improvement of recreational access roads until such time as adequate assurance has been given that the recreational facility is already in operation, or will be developed and operational at the approximate time of completion of the road.
- 5. Not more than \$200,000 of recreational access funds may be allocated for use in any one county, including the towns located therein, or any city in any fiscal year unless these funds are supplemented by funds from other than highway sources, in which case additional recreational access funds may be made available to match the amount contributed, dollar for dollar, but not to exceed a grand total of \$300,000 of recreational access funds.
- It is the intent of the Commissions that recreational access funds not be anticipated from year to year.
- 7. The Highway Commission and the Commission of Outdoor Recreation will consult and should work closely with the Historical Landmarks Commission in designating historical sites eligible for the use of recreational access funds, and may rely on the recommendations of that Commission in making decisions as to the allocation of these funds.
- 8. Prior to the formal request for the use of recreational access funds to provide access to public recreational areas or historical sites, the location of the access road shall be submitted for the approval of the engineers of the Highway Department. In making recommendations the engineers shall take into consideration the cost of the facility as it relates to the location and as it relates to the possibility of future extensions of the road to serve other possible public recreational areas or historical sites, as well as the future development of the area traversed.
- 9. Use of recreational access funds shall be limited to construction of roads providing access to publicly owned recreational areas or historical sites or to officially designated major development units within such areas or sites. These funds shall not be expended for the construction, reconstruction, or maintenance of service roads or trails within recreational areas or historical sites either publicly or privately owned.

Mr. Paul D. Stotts, Assistant Attorney General assigned to the Department of Highways, discussed Senate Joint Resolution adopted by the 1968 General Assembly, requesting a further study of rules and regulations governing issuance of permits for the movement of oversized vehicles on Virginia Highways, and on motion of Judge Weaver, seconded by Mr. Landrith, the following resolution was adopted.

WHEREAS, the Highway Commission has had a policy for some years governing the issuance of permits for the movement of oversized vehicles on State highways, which policy was designed to protect the safety of the traveling public while permitting the greatest possible flexibility in the movement of such vehicles; and

WHEREAS, at the request of the mobilehome industry the Commission and the Highway Department reviewed the administration of the policy relating to the movement of mobilehomes recently and liberalized the rules and regulations for such movements; and

WHEREAS, subsequent to such action by the Commission, the 1968 General Assembly adopted Senate Joint Resolution No. 74 requesting the Highway Commission in cooperation with the Division of Industrial Development and the Department of State Police to reconsider and study further such rules and regulation to the end that a practical and safe method for the transportation and movement of such housing might be evolved:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Highway Commission bereby agrees to reconsider the rules and regulations governing the movement of mobilhomes over State highways and authorizes the Chairman to appoint a three-man subcommittee of the Commission to study this matter in detail and to report its findings and recommendations to the full Commission for its consideration.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the report of the subcommittee should be completed in time for consideration by the full Commission at the November, 1968 meeting.

The chairman then appointed the following committee to conduct this study: Mr. W. Ransdell Chilton, Chairman; Mr. George C. Landrith, and Mr. Earl A. Fitzpatrick, members of the Highway Commission.

Moved by Judge Weaver seconded by Mr. Landrith

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of Henrico County has requested the Highway Commission to undertake such action as may be necessary to obtain a spur connection from Interstate Routes 64 and 95 in the Bryan Park area, southward along the R. F. & P. Railway, and thence easterly to a point near the Boulevard in the City of Richmond, as a part of the Interstate System, to be constructed with Interstate funds, and

WHEREAS, this spur connection would connect with the proposed downtown expressway and other freeways planned by the Richmond Metropolitan Authority, and would in effect actually be a part of same, and

that,

WHEREAS, the Richmond Metropolitan Authority has advised the County that if this spur connection can be built as a portion of the Interstate System, the Authority will be agreeable to extending the proposed Riverside Parkway westerly to a connection with the Parkam Road Circumferential, thus providing service to the western portion of the county, and

WHEREAS, the County recognizes that there is a limit on Interstate mileage, and in consideration of this request is agreeable to the deletion of that segment of Interstate 295 between Route 1, north of Richmond, and Route 64, west of Richmond, and the transfer of this mileage to the proposed spur which would be built in lieu of the above described segment of Route 295, and

WHEREAS, this has been endorsed by the Board of Directors of the Richmond Metropolitan Authority by resolution dated June 26, 1968, and has also been endorsed by the City Manager of the City of Richmond in a letter of June 26, 1968, to the Highway Commissioner, and

WHEREAS, the engineering staff of the Commission have studied this proposal and feel that it would be in the best interest of the Richmond Metropolitan area, therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the State Highway Commission requests the Bureau of Public Roads to add a spur connection as herein described to the Interstate System in Virginia in lieu of a segment of Route 295, and directs the engineering staff to make formal application for this change in the Interstate routing in the Richmond Metropolitan area to the Bureau of Public Roads.

WHEREAS, the Occonseches Regional Park located south of Route 58 and just east of Clarksville, in Mecklepburg County, will be established as a state park effective July 1, 1968; and

WHEREAS, it is requested by Mr. Ben H. Bolen, Commissioner of the Division of Parks, and recommended by our Highway Engineers that certain roads within the grounds of the Occonecchee State Park in Mecklenburg County be added to the Primary System of Highways; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED, that pursuant to Section 33-24 of the Code of Virginia of 1950, as amended, the network of roads totaling 8.47 miles comprised of 1.82 miles on present secondary Route 851 and 6.65 miles of new driveways, all within the area of the Occonecchee State Park, be added to the Primary System of Highways to become effective July 1, 1968; and that the road additions be designated Route 364, as indicated on the plat dated May 1, 1968.

MOTION CARRIED.

Mr. Paul Johnson, Superintendent of Hydro Generation, Appalachian Power Company, reported on progress of the Appalachian Development Project, which is holding up improvement of Route 58 between Galax and Independence.

He said the Power Company hopes to have a license for the project by sometime in 1969 and that they will begin work on the dam within a year after receipt of license. He said as soon as the license is received the Power Company will accept responsibility for necessary relocation of roads and that the in-service date for the highway will probably not be much later than originally expected.

Mr. Fugate said it would take a year to prepare plans and that the Highway Department should be in position to advertise for contract sometime next summer and if construction could be started concurrently with award of the license, in late summer of 1969, the project could be completed in the fall of 1971 - if the Department has sufficient funds.

Mr. James V. Noonkester, Member of the Board of Supervisors of Montgomery County, appeared before the Commission to again ask for relief for traffic which had used a road through the Radford Arsenal until recently closed by the U.S. Government. He asked that Routes 658 and 659 be recognized as one road and that sufficient funds be allocated to bring this road up to Primary standards and it be taken into the primary system.

Mr. Fugate told Mr. Noonkester that if the County wishes these roads taken into the primary system the Board should make such request and it would then be reviewed as to whether the roads meet established criteria for transfer to the primary system. He said if these roads do not meet the criteria and therefore cannot be added to the primary system, the only other solution would be to try to get Route 659 improved in the Montgomery County secondary system. He said that this would be a problem because of the lack of funds but that it might be financed over a period of several years as funds become available.

Mr. L. R. Finn, President of Hanley Structures, Inc., appeared before the Commission again requesting permit to haul prefabricated school buildings in excess of legal widths over a section of Virginia roads in order to make deliveries from their plant in Elizabethton, Tennessee, to points in West Virginia.

Mr. Fugate said permits for movement of 12' wide vehicles on roads not approved for such movement had been denied firms based in Virginia and that unless permits could be granted for all 12' wide vehicles, he could not recommend issuance of a permit to Hanley Structures as a special privilege. He said he would have the submission by Hanley Structures, as to pavement width on Route 460 between Blacksburg and the West Virginia Line, studied by the Staff of the Department to determine whether exceptions can be made and allow permits to everybody who wants to haul 12 ft. wide loads over this route.

The chairman stated the July meeting would be held at Marion, Virginia on July 18.

The meeting was adjourned at 11:45 A.M.
