WHEREAS, an agreement has been entered into with the owners of property belonging to R. J. Motion carried.

Moved by Judge Weaver , seconded by Mr. Fitspatrick, that WHEMEAS, a section of Route 817 in Mecklenburg County, located just west of the Town of Chase City, and just south of its intersection with Route 600, has been relocated in order to clear the approach zone of the Chase City Airport, and the owner of the land adjoining the former location of Route 817 and through whose property the new location passes has agreed to convey to the Counconwealth the necessary right of way for the new location in exchange for the right of way of the old location; and,

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of Mecklenburg County, by resolution duly passed and recorded in the minutes of their regula: meeting held on December 7, 1964, did abandon in accordance with the provisions of Section 33-76.12 of the 1950 Gode of Virginia as amended the section of old location of said Route 817 consisting of about 0.13 mile between the intersection of Route 600 and the intersection of the new location of said Route 817; and

WHEREAS, the State Highway Commissioner has certified in writing that the said old location of Route 817 so shandoned by the Board of Supervisors is deemed no longer necessary for the uses of the Secondary System of State Highways.

HOW THEREFORE, the conveyance of whatever interest the Commonwealth may have in and to the said section of former location of Route 817 so certified and so abandoned to the owner or owners of record of the adjoining lands is hereby approved, and the State Highway Commissioner is authorized to execute in the name of the Commonwealth a deed of quitclain accordingly. Motion carried,

Hoved, by Mr. Holland , seconded by Judge Weaver that, WHEREAS, in connection with Interstate Route 264, Project 0264-122-101, RW-202 in the City of Morfolk the Commonwealth has acquired or is in the process of acquiring all of the lands within the erea bounded by ClayAvenue on the northwest, Rose Avenue on the southwest and Bramblaton Avenue on the northwest in accordance with the provisions of Section 33-117.2 of the 1950 Code of Virginia as amended; and,

WHEREAS, a postion of the said lands belongs to the Morfolk Shipbuilding and Drydock Corporation, and the said Corporation has entered into an agreement which provides in part that the unused residues of the several parcels of lands so to be acquired will be conveyed to the said Corporation in partial exchange for the lands needed from it for the said Routs and Project; and,

WHEREAS, the State Righway Commissioner has certified in writing that he deems the exchange of those parcels so to be acquired which front upon said Claiborne and Rose Avenues and which lie southwest of the new southwest right of way and limited access line of the said Route and Project, to be in the public interest.

HOW, THEREFORE, in accordance with the provisions of Section 33-117.4 of the 1950 Code of Virginia as smended the conveyance of the said lands so certified with the Morfolk Shipbuilding and Drydock Corporation in partial exchange for ether lands required from it is hereby approved and the State Highway Commissioner is bareby authorized to execute a deed in the name of the Commonwealth conveying same without warranty, after title to the said lands has vested in the Commonwealth, and subject to such terms and conditions as he may deem requisite. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Pitspatrick , seconded by Mr. Chilton, that WHEREAS, by proper resolutions, the Hoands of Supervisors of Henry and Pulaski Counties have requested that certain roads which no longer serve as a public necessity be discontinued as parts of the Secondary System of Highmays;

NOW, THEREFORE, RR IT RESOLVED, that pursuant to Section 33-76.7 of the Code of Virginia of 1950, as amended, the following roads be discontinued as part of the Secondary Byston of Highways, effective this date. HEMEY COUNTY

Motion carried.

Noved by Mr. Chilton , seconded by Judge Weaver, that WHINEAS, Route 3 (old Route 37) in Stafford County has been altered and reconstructed as shown on plans for Project 438-A; and

WHEREAS, one section of the old road is no longer necessary as a public road, the new road serving the same citizens as the old road:

MOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that pursuant to Section 33-76.5 of the Code of Virginia of 1950, as amended, a section of old location of Route 3 (37), approximately 200 feet, extending from east right-of-way line of present Route 3 north-east to the northwest line of Deblgren Railroad, be spendoned as a part of the State Highway System; as shown in blue and designated as Section 1 on the plat dated August 11, 1965, Project 438-A. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Holland , seconded by Mr. Landrith, that WHERRAS, the Highway Commission at its meeting on July 15, 1965, adopted a resolution transferring 0.50 mile of present Route 828 to the Primary System of Highways between Interstate Boute 66 and the intersection of Route 29-211 in Fairfax County; and

become effective until completion of construction on present Route 828, Project 0828-029-114, C-501, be it resolved that the resolution beretofore adopted be and is hereby enended to read as follows:

"WHEREAS, Section 33-26 of the 1950 Code of Virginia, as amended, authorizes the State Highway Commission to add such roads, bridges and streets as it shall deem proper, and to transfer from the Secondary System to the Primary System such roads, bridges, and streets as it shall deem proper, not to exceed fifty miles during any one year; and

WHEREAS, recommendations are made by our Highway Engineers to extend present State Route 243, from the interchange of Interstate Route 66 in Fairfax County southerly to connect with Route 29-211;

NOW, THEREPORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the connection be provided by transferring existing Secondary Route 828 to the Primary System of Highways, and designated as Eoute 243, beginning at interchange of Route 66 just south of Vienna and extending southerly 0.50 mile to the intersection of Route 29-211, affective upon completion of construction on present Route 828, Project 0828-829-114, C501."

Motion carried.

The Department's plans for observance of Mational Highway Weak were outlined by Mr. Coates, Public Information Officer. He said Governor Marrison would issue a statument asking citizens of Virginia to observe Highway Week and that the district tours which have been a highlight of previous years are again planned for this year. He reported a 16-page supplement on the highway program would be published in the RICHMOND TIMES DISPATCH of September 19.

The Commission, on motion of Judge Weaver, seconded by Mr. Landrith, adopted the following resolution on the observance of Highway Week.

WHEREAS, good highways save lives, time and money, and are essential to Virginia's continued accounting growth, and

WHERRAS, Virginia is making impressive progress in building its portion of the National System of Interstate and Dafanas Highways, and has initiated development of an Arterial network to supplement the interstate highways, and

WHEREAS, the week of September 19, 1965, has been designated as Marianal Michael Wook

designated as Mational Highway Week,

NOW, THEREFORE, ZE IT RESOLVED that this Highway Commission fully endorses this observance, and invites all citizens of Virginia to take this opportunity to reflect on the value of good roads in their daily lives.

On motion of Mr. Holland, seconded by Mr. Landrith, the Commission approved the Annual Operating and Maintenance Budget of the Toll Revenue Projects for the bond year commencing September 1, 1965, as attached.

In presenting the above budget, Mr. Eure stated traffic on the Hempton Boads Bridge-Tunnel Bystom had reached 17,000 vpd. Mr. Holland stated that in another five years the traffic would reach 22,000 vpd, which is the capacity of the system and that another tube will be needed.

Mr. Fugate said an additional tube had been included in the Interestate System cost estimate, at a total cost of \$48 Million, and that if there can be devised ways and wears of paying off the present tell revenue debt before the Interstate program ends the Department can take adventage of this. Mr. Yugate stated the Department had requested bids on construction of a Norfolk-Virginia Beach toll road and that if bids received are within the estimates of the consulting engineers it is proposed to finance a toll revenue bond issue of approximately \$35 Million, possibly around the middle of October. He said the Commission of course wishes to maintain the 25¢ toll recommended by the traffic consultants and that if this is done the coverage is not quite as good as it might be if the toll rate were higher. He thought every effort possible should be made to keep the 25¢ toll rate and that to make a more attractive toll revenue issue at an attractive interest rate, the Highest Department should assume the maintenance of this roadway when it is completed. He said if the Commission approves the assumption of maintenance it may set a precedent which would have implications for other toll facilities operated by the Department.

Mr. Fugate said Senator Bunter Andrews is chairman of a commission established by the 1964 General Assembly to look into the toll projects with a view to making recommendations as to toll schedules and toll financing and it could well be that the Commission may wish to consider in future years some maintenance relief for those projects. He thought this should not be considered until the study commission's report is released and that the Highesty Commission should be guided by the recommendations of that commission, within the limitations of funds available in the Suffolk District. He recommended that in order to make a more attractive toll revenue issue for the Virginia Beach Toll Road and to obtain the best interest rate available, the Highesty Commission adopt a resolution which expressed the intent of the Commission to assume maintenance on this facility.

On motion of Mr. Holland, seconded by Mr. Landrith, the following resolution was adopted:

THAT WHEREAS, by virtue of Chapter 399 of the Acts of Assembly 1940, known and cited as the "State Revenue Bond Act" and now codified as Article 8 of Chapter 3 of Title 33 of the Gode of Virginia (1950), as amended, the State Highway Commission is authorised to continue certain projects as toll revenue projects; and

WHEREAS, by resolution adopted February 21, 1963, this Commission authorized the Highway Department to proceed with the construction of the Norfolk-Virginia Beach Highway; and

WHEREAS, the Highway Department is now ready to proceed with the advertisement for bide for the construction of this project and the sale of the necessary bonds; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of this Commission to assist in the financing of the project by assuming the maintenance cost from highway funds.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED: That the State Highway Commission hereby expresses its intent to make annual allocations from highway funds for the maintenance of the Morfolk-Virginia Beach Highway pursuant to Section 33-248 of the Code of Virginia (1950), as amended, after the completion of the project.

Mr. Landrith asked if the State's assumption of maintenance on these facilities would accelerate the retirement of bonds. Mr. Fugate replied that it would, that the study commission is locking into this and has explored the possibilities with the Department. He said an acceleration of the debt retirement has a great deal to do with whether or not the Department can take advantage of the Interstate program for building another tube across Hempton Bonds; that this could not be done until the present tunnel becomes tell free.

The meeting was adjourned at 10:45 A. M.
