ARRA Allocation: Highway Projects

- VDOT received \$694.5 M in ARRA funds with \$576.7 million allocation by the CTB
- The CTB has approved \$669.8 million in projects as candidates for ARRA funds, including contingency paving and construction projects

Summary of ARRA Highway Projects

- 74 highway projects have been approved by the CTB
 - 47 projects have been obligated with total value of \$306.4 M
 - 39 projects have been advertised with total value of \$337.8 M
 - 22 projects have been awarded with a total value of \$136.8 M
- On 9/17 CTB will consider award for Fort Eustis with an estimated value of \$19.8 million
- October anticipate bringing some of the design build bridge projects and two congestion relief projects to CTB for \$92.3 million
- To date awarded contracts have been \$16.8 M under allocated ARRA funding; 5 additional paving projects were awarded for \$14.9 million

MPO Sub-allocated ARRA Funds

- \$117.8 M of Virginia's ARRA highway funds were sub-allocated to the state's 5 large MPOs – Richmond, Tri-Cities, Fredericksburg, Northern Virginia, and Hampton Roads
- VDOT staff have worked closely with the MPOs to identify projects that meet the requirements and goals of ARRA
- VDOT staff continue to work with MPOs to certify and obligate MPO projects
- All 5 MPOs have identified candidate projects for ARRA funding
- MPOs have until March 2, 2010 to obligate their sub-allocated funds or they are withdrawn for redistribution

 - Identified 3 projects for ARRA funding
 - Route 10 (Chesterfield) \$10.1 million
 - Route 250 (Goochland) \$6.0 million
 - Route 95 (Hanover) \$4.8 million
 - Staff recommends the addition of Richmond MPO ARRA projects to the FY10-15 SYIP on September 17, 2009

- Tri-Cities MPO \$3.3 million
 - Identified 2 projects for ARRA funding
 - Paving and resurfacing various routes (Tri-Cities) \$2.6 million
 - Paving and resurfacing various routes (Colonial Heights) \$0.7 million
 - Staff recommends the addition of Tri-Cities MPO ARRA projects to the FY10-15 SYIP on September 17, 2009

- Fredericksburg MPO \$1.4 million
 - Identified 1 project
 - Rest Area Interchange and Toll Road (Fredericksburg and Spotsylvania) - \$1.4 million
 - Additional evaluation is necessary to determine if project can be obligated by the deadline for ARRA funds

 - Identified 20 projects

Rail ARRA Update

- On August 24, 2009 Virginia submitted to FRA a \$75 million Track 1
 ARRA application for Arkendale to Powell's Creek Third Track project
 to support the advancement of high speed rail in the I-95 Corridor
 - FRA project decisions expected mid-October
- DRPT is in the process of developing a \$1.7 billion Track 2 ARRA application for further I-95 Corridor development that is due to FRA on October 2, 2009
 - FRA project decisions expected December
- DRPT plans to submit a Track 2, round 2 application for improvements between Richmond and Hampton Roads in Spring 2010
- Virginia received \$10 M in ARRA highway funding for ACCA Yard Final Design

3rd Main line sections Fredericksburg to Richmond – 32 miles 4th Main line section Fredericksburg to Mine Road – 5 miles

Acca Yard improvements in 2 Phases – 6 miles South Acca to Main Street Sta/Area/Fulton/Platforms – 13 miles



ARRA Transit: Urbanized Formula Grants

- Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Authority
 - \$202 million; facilities, buses, equipment
- Virginia Railway Express
 - \$9.8 million; locomotives
- Potomac and Rappahannock Transportation Commission
 - \$3.9 million; bus and capital replacement
- Greater Richmond Transit Company
 - \$13.8 million; transit center, paratransit vehicles
- Hampton Roads Transit
 - \$24.1 million; facilities buses, equipment

ARRA Transit Obligation Update

- In accordance with the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009, 50% of the \$30,548,352 transit ARRA funds apportioned to Virginia had to be obligated by September 1, 2009
- DRPT met that goal, by obligating \$17,344,006, or 56.78%, of our total apportionment through the first round of applications, approved by the CTB in April of 2009
- The second application period for the remaining ARRA funds closed on September 14. DRPT has received ~\$28 million in applications
 - Recommended projects will be presented at October meeting with awards considered at November meeting

Transit ARRA Update

Operating Assistance

- H.R. 2346, Supplemental Appropriations Act of 2009, provided opportunity to use 10% of ARRA Transit Capital funds for operating assistance
- DRPT has requested CTB approval to transfer \$1,855,516 of the rural and \$1,199,319 of the small urban apportionment to supplement FY2010 MTTF operating assistance grants to offset FY10 revenue reductions

Where We Are

- Five small urban transit systems have started procurement under their ARRA funding
- Three small urban transit systems have already awarded the RFPs or will have them awarded within the next 90 days

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
