\$3.7 Billion to replace all deficient bridge structures

- TIP amendments through MPOs as necessary
- Governor certifies the project list to the USDOT
- Obligate funds with FHWA
- Execute projects

# **Highways: \$27.5 Billion Nationwide**

- Virginia will receive \$694.5 Million
  - Enhancements: 3% \$20.8 million
  - STP formula: 30% \$208.4 million
  - Statewide: 67% \$465.3 million
- States must obligate at least 50% of discretionary funds within <u>120 days</u>
- Successful states may receive bonus distribution from those states or programs that have not fully obligated federal funds

#### **ARRA Allocation: Highway Projects**

- At the April CTB meeting \$328 million in initial paving, bridge, BRAC, rail and locally-committed projects was approved
- At the May CTB meeting \$204 million was approved for a total of \$532 approved by the CTB
- The total awarded to VDOT for allocation by the CTB was \$576 million, leaving \$44 million left to be approved by the Board

### Mandatory Enhancement Projects: \$20.8 Million

#### **BRAC Projects: \$96 Million**

- Fort Lee (Richmond) 7,800 BRAC Jobs
  - Route 36 Corridor Prince George County and City of Hopewell
  - \$11.4 million
- Fort Belvoir (NoVA) 11,900 BRAC Jobs
  - Fairfax County Parkway Phase III & IV Fairfax County
  - \$60.1 million
- Fort Eustis (Hampton Roads) 1,700 BRAC Jobs
  - Fort Eustis Blvd York County and City of Newport News
  - \$24.5 million

#### Structurally Deficient and Functionally Obsolete Bridges: \$116.1 Million

- 119 small structurally deficient bridges to be repaired through 7 design build contracts \$66.1 million
- Robertson Bridge (Danville) \$28.9 million
- Route 61 Narrows Bridge (Narrows) \$15.7 million
- Route 630/CSX Bridge (Stafford) \$5.4 million

## **Deficient Pavements: \$114.5 Million**

- 430+ lane miles of interstate and primary highway paving or overlay
- Pavement index of 53 or less for most of the segments
- No right-of-way required and environmental documentation complete
- \$110.9 Million in estimated contract value
- CTB approved additional pavement projects to allow additional projects to be advanced if initial projects come in under bid
- Mercury Blvd. paving (Hampton) \$3.6 million

## Rail Projects: \$61.7 Million

- Route 164 Rail relocation (Portsmouth) \$9.0 million
- NIT Central Rail Yard (Norfolk) \$17.8 million
- Acca Yard PE (Richmond/Henrico) \$10.0 million
- Route 28 Manassas Rail Grade Crossing \$24.9 million

#### Highway Construction: \$122.9 Million

- Route 3 widening (Spotsylvania Co) \$25.2 million
- Princess Anne Road widening (Virginia Beach) \$16.7 million
- Port Republic Road (Harrisonburg) \$22.1 million
- Fair Lakes Interchange (Fairfax Co) \$13.0 million
- I-64 Safety Improvements (Alleghany) \$19.0 million
- I-64 Exit Improvements (Charlottesville) \$2.7 million
- Courthouse Road Interchange (Arlington) \$10.3 million

- FHWA has obligated \$287 million
- VDOT has advertised \$246 million and \$81 million awarded
