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Transportation Planning Activities for 2007

- **Need for early identification of transportation issues and coordination**

 - **Logistics Transportation Working Group formed in mid-2000**
 - **Represents major public and private interests**
 - **Produced concept transportation plan for 2007**

 - **Objectives of Transportation Plan**
 - **Minimize congestion impacts on regional highway system**
 - **Maximize choice in transportation services**
 - **Minimize impacts to local community by separating visitor and local traffic**
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Current Efforts

- **Elements initiated**
 - **Configuration of shuttle bus services for major events**
 - **Inventory of regional transportation services**
 - **Island/Settlement bus circulation patterns**
 - **Identification of parking locations**
 - **Informational brochures**
 - **Determination of transportation funding needs**
 - **Signage plan**
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Background Transportation Issues

- **Adequate regional highway access to the Historic Triangle area (I-64, U.S. 17, etc.)**
 - **Constrained access on two-lane highways to Settlement and Jamestown Island**
 - **Limited changes to local highway system by 2007 beyond completion of four-lane Route 199**
 - **Limited venue parking capacity at Settlement and Jamestown Island**
 - **Need for a transit/travel demand management emphasis for major events**
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Basic Elements of the Plan

- **Highway improvements**
 - **Complete planned regional improvements**
 - **Clear any ongoing construction**
 - **Park-and-Ride facilities**
 - **Near regional access points (I-64, SR 199) for major events**
 - **Additional local parking for “mid-sized” events**
 - **Local transit and ferry services**
 - **Bus-only access for major events**
 - **Increased bus services in “visitor” corridors**
 - **Enhanced ferry services across James River**
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Basic Elements of the Plan (continued)

- **Traffic management**
 - **Use signage, signal timing, and police forces to manage traffic**
 - **Maximize use of VDOT's visitor information system**
 - **Add directional signs for general orientation**
 - **Deploy temporary directional signs for Island/Settlement access**

 - **Visitor information**
 - **Supply information at home, en route, and in town**
 - **Use all media, especially the web**

Getting to the Anniversary Weekend Venue

Getting to Jamestown Island and Ballblazer in 2007 on America's Anniversary Weekend, May 11-13th 2007

Public and Private Lots and Situations

During the May 11-13th Commemorative weekend, visitors will be able to access the commemorative venues in Jamestown only by taking a shuttle bus or ferry from one of 10 convenient park and ride locations in and around the Historic Triangle. There will be park and ride lots at the following venue locations:

- Eastern State Hospital, Lurgill Road, Williamsburg
- Colonial Williamsburg, Visitor Center Parking lot, Frances Street, Williamsburg
- Water Country, Williamsburg
- Dutch Quarter, Powhatan Trail, Williamsburg
- Chesler Park, Santa Anna, Yorktown

All shuttle buses are handicapped-accessible. A list of current parking spaces at the venue are available for persons with disabilities, by permit only. Call 304-300-3000 for more details.

In addition to the Park and Ride Lots, Jamestown 2007 will operate shuttle buses to the commemorative venues continuously from the following locations:

- Colonial Williamsburg Visitor Center
- U.S. M. Hotel and Restaurant Center
- Yorktown Battlefield

Shuttle Ferry Services

The Goddard Ferry will shuttle visitors from Berry County across the James River to the Jamestown Island and Ballblazer. Ferries will leave for docks every 15 minutes. Visitors will park/ferry vehicles on the Berry County side and board a shuttle bus to Jamestown.

Flagstaff Half Services

Hourly rail service from Newport News, Washington and Richmond to Williamsburg will be available during the Anniversary Weekend.

Motorcycle Facilities and Accommodations

Bicycles will not be permitted on the Colonial Parkway during the Anniversary weekend. The Parkway will be operating as a bus-only facility during that time.

What you should know...

The Commemorative venues and the park and ride lots will be accessed by shuttle and local public during the Anniversary Weekend. Visitors will not be permitted to enter the venues with firearms, food or firearms. All bags are subject to search by the police and severely processed.

Visitors are encouraged to give themselves plenty of time to enter the venue.

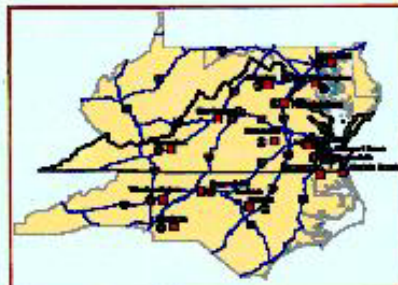


A constant stream of visitors from around the world come to the "Historic Triangle" each year. Your options for getting to Jamestown 2007 include:

Air
 Newark International, Richmond International, and Newport News/Williamsburg Airports are all less than 45 minutes away. Ground transportation is available from all three.

Rail
 Direct AMTRAK service from Boston, New York, Philadelphia, Baltimore and Washington. Special direct services will be provided for the anniversary weekend, May 11-15, 2007.

Bus
 Charter Bus service from New York, Washington, Baltimore, Richmond and Norfolk. Call 304-300-3000 for more details.



Basic Elements of the Plan (continued)

- Provide expanded intercity service along existing rail lines
 - Potential rescheduling of freight operations
 - Bus Needs – roughly 230 needed for May event
 - Higher than normal needs during balance of year
 - Estimated costs for transportation elements ~ \$9.0 million
 - Includes bus lease, operations, and parking
 - Estimate will be refined as event planning proceeds
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Planning and Organizational Recommendations

- **Develop and implement a free ticketing program for all major events**
- **Develop joint ticketing programs combining transportation, lodging, and passes**



CTB Support

- **Encourage appropriate VDOT and DRPT support for the planning process**
 - **Coordination with partner agencies**
 - **Concept and operations plan**
 - **Funding for transportation program**
 - **Encourage public-sector partners to provide “in-kind” resources**
 - **Encourage private-sector partners to participate as needed**
 - **Parking is critical**
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Next Steps

- **Develop MOUs with land owners for parking**
 - **Coordinate bus needs with event itinerary for Jamestown 2007**
 - **Develop leasing arrangements with regional transit providers**
 - **Continuing outreach to potential Jamestown 2007 partners**
 - **Continue to develop regional traffic operations/traffic management plan for Historic Area**
 - **Develop traveler information web site**
 - **Consider security impacts on movement of vehicles and people**
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
