

Minutes of the
Meeting of the State Highway Commission
of Virginia, held in Richmond
June 16, 1942.

At 9:00 A. M. on Tuesday, June 16th, 1942, the State Highway Commission, consisting of Messrs. J. A. Anderson, Chairman, S. W. Rawls, Secretary, Howard C. Rogers and J. F. Wyser, met in their office, Central Highway Office Building, Richmond, Virginia.

The meeting was called to order by the Chairman.

Mr. Kenneth B. Gilpin is on leave of absence for military duties with the Army Air Corps. The Chairman was directed to write Mr. Gilpin that he was greatly missed.

General Anderson stated to the Commission that this would probably be the last meeting of the present Commission and that he had invited the Division heads to lunch with the Commission at noon. He also stated that he would have the minutes of this meeting mimeographed in order to furnish the new Commission members with a copy, as well as the Division Heads, in order that they might be fully informed.

Moved by Mr. Rawls, seconded by General Anderson that the minutes of March 20th meeting be approved as sent to the Commission. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Rawls, seconded by Mr. Wyser, that the permits issued from March 20th to June 16th inclusive be approved, as recorded in the Auditing Office. Motion carried.

Each Member of the Commission received a letter from the Chairman presenting the problems confronting the Department relative to the War Effort and the Highway Program. This letter follows:

"For just about two years the Highway Department has been feeling the effects of the Defense Program and the War Effort.

This first caused an increase in Highway Traffic and Highway Revenues and these increases continued through December 1941.

As a result of larger revenues the Commission allocated for Primary Construction-

\$3,000,000 accumulated surplus for 1940-'41
4,260,000 anticipated surplus for '41-'42
15,000,000 anticipated revenues for '42-'43.

Then came increases in the Defense Program which caused rigid

priorities for critical materials. Wherever we could we redesigned, substituted and continued our construction program.

A program of 'access' roads was launched in the fall of '41. Congress appropriated funds to make these roads, in most cases, Federally financed. These roads along with 'flight strips' and the Shirley Highway will cost more than 18 millions and gives us the largest construction program we have ever had under way at one time.

With the coming of the war in December automobile and truck manufacture was practically stopped and a most rigid tire rationing program was set up.

Then came the L-41 order of the War Production Board which stopped all new construction of any consequence without the approval of the Board.

Gasoline rationing, a severe rationing of bituminous materials so largely used in maintenance and construction in our State, and other restrictions have played a major part in shrinking our revenues and curtailing our work.

Before the Legislature adjourned we had a bill passed restricting expenditures on the Secondary System to 30% of our revenues with a lower limit of \$5,000,000.

Personnel.

With the loss of a large percentage of our trained help and engineers to the War Effort we have adopted the policy of not making replacements unless absolutely essential. We are, however, trying to replace our personnel engaged in the making of surveys, plans and estimates for we feel that we should have as large a reservoir of projects as possible to get under way quickly when the emergency is over.

Equipment.

It is extremely difficult to obtain spare parts. New equipment is out of the question. The Department is still operating trucks manufactured in '17 and '18. So long as some of our tools and some of our mechanics are available we expect to keep the necessary maintenance equipment ready for use.

Maintenance.

With the shortage of personnel and equipment and a serious reduction in funds our maintenance operations are being reduced wherever they can be without detriment to our capital investment.

Traffic and Revenue-

Both are being greatly reduced.

For the fiscal year '42-'43 the reduction in revenues may amount to 45%, as compared to 1940-'41.

New Speed Limits-

Following the proclamation of the Governor reducing the maximum speed of all vehicles to forty miles per hour, the Department has placed large and conspicuous signs near the corporate limits of all cities and large towns and at intervals along the main routes. The new speed limits are being well observed.

Reaction of the Public-

We feel that the people of Virginia are keenly aware of the conditions brought about by the war, and that they are in sympathy with the changes being made.

Unusual Problems-

Floods have caused damage to the amount of \$100,000. This was confined largely to the Staunton District.

While many employee classifications are difficult to fill the Department has had a loss of 545 of its men in Engineering positions. Trained men are not available so we are doing the best we can with the replacements we can find.

Our allocations and schedules are being reprogrammed for both the Primary and Secondary Systems. Each member of the Commission will be furnished with a copy of the proposed changes.

Attitude of Highway Department Employees-

Our personnel are meeting every call for extra work and sacrifice that is being made. They are exercising real ingenuity in devising new methods to meet current problems. All of us expect an almost total conversion to war purposes of all the resources of the Nation. Every employee is doing cheerfully what is necessary to adjust themselves to new conditions as they develop."

Moved by Mr. Roads, seconded by Mr. Wynn, that the Commission confirm rejection of bids on Project S 630 Cl, R2, Route 49, Little Nottoway River Bridge and Approaches. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Wygant, seconded by Mr. Rogers, that the Commission confirm rejection of bids on Project S 384 A2, Route 150, 0.4 Mi. S. Amherst-Macon County Line to Intersection Route 29 at Colleen. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Roads, seconded by Mr. Wynn, that the Commission confirm award of contract for the construction of Project S 761 EM1, 187 G, Route 15, 0.2 Mi. N. of SCL Farmville - 0.2 Mi. S. SCL Farmville, to the low bidder, Laramore Construction Company, Danville, Va., at their bid of \$42,849.15, and that 10% additional be set aside to cover the cost of engineering and additional work, making a total of approximately \$47,100.00 chargeable to this project. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Wysor, seconded by Mr. Rogers, that the Commission confirm award of contract for the construction of Project S 55 ER1, El. Route 58, 1.6 Mi. E. E&L Stuart-O.5 Mi. E. E&L Stuart, to the low bidder, W. E. Graham and Sons, Chatham, Va., at their bid of \$39,843.19, that 10% additional be set aside to cover the cost of engineering and additional work and \$900.00 for work by State Forces, making a total of approximately \$46,300.00 chargeable to this project; provided that in the event materials for structure or structures cannot be secured the State reserves the right to cancel that part of the contract. Motion carried.

Moved by General Anderson, seconded by Mr. Wysor, that the Commission confirm award of contract for the construction of Project S 1169-B2, B2, Route 260, 1.3 Mi. N. Rockingham County Line-Intersection Route 262 in Forestville, to the low bidder, R. W. Moore, Staunton, Va., at his bid of \$74,877.98, and that 10% additional be set aside to cover the cost of engineering and additional work, making a total of approximately \$82,400.00 chargeable to this project; provided that in the event materials for structure or structures cannot be secured the State reserves the right to cancel that part of the contract. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Rogers, seconded by General Anderson, that the Commission confirm award of contract for the construction of Project DA-NR 1286 A, Route 60, North Boundary of Fort Monroe- Ferry Slip in Fort Monroe, to the low bidder, Eastern Supply Co., Inc., Richmond, Va., at their bid of \$180,452.94, that 10% additional be set aside to cover the cost of engineering and additional work, and \$2,233.00 for work by the Railroad, making a total of approximately \$200,700.00 chargeable to this project; provided it can be financed 100 percent from Federal Access Road Funds. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Rawls, seconded by Mr. Rogers, that the Commission confirm award of contract for the construction of Project DA-NR 1288 A2, B2, 3,4, Route 239, 0.28 Mi. E. of Intersection Route 167-North Boundary of Fort Monroe, to the low bidder, T. E. Ritter Company (Corp.) Norfolk, Va., at their bid of \$424,085.75, that 10% additional be set aside to cover the cost of engineering and additional work, \$263.00 for work by Virginia Public Service Company, \$52,000.00 Right of Way and \$3,074.00 for work by the Chesapeake and Ohio Railway, making a total of approximately \$741,900.00 chargeable to this project; provided the project can be financed 100 percent from Federal Access Road Funds. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Wysor, seconded by Mr. Rogers, that the Commission confirm award of contract for the construction of Project DA-NR 1288 A1, El. Route 239, 0.1 Mi. W. Intersection Route 168-0.26 Mi. E. Intersection Route 167, to the low bidder, Rae Construction Company, Charlotte, N.C., and Perkins-Barne Construction Company, Inc., Blackstone, Va., at their bid of \$674,961.70, that 10% additional be set aside to cover the cost of engineering and additional work, \$2,749.00 for Force Account work and \$58,000.00 for Right of Way, making a total of approximately \$803,200.00 chargeable to this project, provided the work is financed 100 percent from Federal Access Road Funds. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Wysor, seconded by Mr. Rogers, that the Commission confirm award of contract for the construction of Project DA WI 1164 DB1, ARI, CR1, MI, Route 114, 1.0 Mi. E. Montgomery-Pulaski County Line-Intersection Route 11, to the low bidder, W. E. Graham and Sons, Chatham, Va., at their bid of \$276,389.66, that 10% additional be set aside to cover the cost of engineering and additional work, \$9,224.00 for work by the Railroad and \$10,000.00 for Right of Way, making a total of approximately \$323,200.00 chargeable to this project; provided the work is financed 100 percent from Federal Access Road Funds. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Rogers, seconded by Mr. Rawls, that the Commission confirm award of contract for the construction of Project S 512 IS1, Route 19, 0.9 Mi. N. of Intersection Route 58-2, 2 Mi. S. of Holston River, to the low bidder, R. H. Balling, Norton, Va., at his bid of \$144,605.36 and that 10% additional be set aside to cover the cost of engineering and additional work, making a total of approximately \$159,100.00 chargeable to this project. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Rawls, seconded by Mr. Wysor, that the Commission confirm award of contract for the construction of Project DA MR 1284 NS, Routes 13, 170 and 460, On Poindexter Street from Corner of Chesapeake Avenue along Poindexter Street to Bainbridge Boulevard, to the low bidder, T. E. Ritter Company, (Corp.) Norfolk, Va., at their bid of \$75,647.25, that 10% additional be set aside to cover the cost of engineering and additional work and \$12,200.00 for Right of Way, making a total of approximately \$95,400.00 chargeable to this project; provided concurrence in award is secured from the Public Roads Administration and authorisation of the necessary funds for the project. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Wysor, seconded by General Anderson, that the Commission confirm rejection of bids on Project S 746 IS1, NS1, Route 60, Powhatan County line-Cumberland Court House, and not readvertise unless there are indications that a bid can be secured approximately within the estimate. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Rogers, seconded by Mr. Rawls, that the Commission confirm award of contract for the construction of Project DA MR 1290 MI,2, MI,A; 345 AWI,2, Routes 60, 671 and 305, 0.7 Mi. S. of SCL Virginia Beach-Fort Story, to the low bidder, Ames and Webb, Inc., Norfolk, Va., at their bid of \$233,583.29, that 10% additional be set aside to cover the cost of engineering and additional work, \$330.00 for work by the Railroad and \$14,300.00 for Right of Way, making a total of approximately \$271,500.00 chargeable to this project; the Department to participate to the amount of 25% in section AWI, further recommendation for the \$34,600.00 necessary to be made later. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Davis, seconded by General Anderson, that the Commission confirm award of contract for the construction of Project DA MR 1277 DBL, Routes 13 and 157, 0.16 Mi. N. Intersection Route 56-Intersection Route 351, to the low bidder, Beckler Brothers, Highland Springs, Va., at their bid of \$411,682.73, that 10% additional be set aside to cover the cost of engineering and additional work and \$80,000.00 for right of way, making a total of approximately \$532,600.00 chargeable to this project. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Myror, seconded by Mr. Davis, that the Commission confirm award of contract for the construction of Project DA MR 1289-A, Route 238, Intersection Route 17- Naval Mine Warfare School Fuel Oil Station, York County, to the low bidder, G. P. Clay, Box 481, Richmond, Va., at his bid of \$28,346.04, that 10% additional be set aside to cover the cost of engineering and additional work and \$200.00 for Right of Way, making a total of approximately \$31,600.00 chargeable to this project. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Rogers, seconded by General Anderson, that the Commission confirm award of contract for the construction of Project S 1297-Bl-Tl, Route 17, Site Dovings for Bridge over York River at Yorktown, to the low bidder, The Giles Drilling Corporation, 18 E. 48th Street, New York City, at their bid of \$20,587.50 and that 10% additional be set aside to cover the cost of engineering and additional work, making a total of approximately \$22,600.00 chargeable to this project. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Myror, seconded by Mr. Davis, that the Commission confirm award of contract for the construction of Project DA MR 1233 AME, Route 168, 2.1 Mi. E. Intersection 39th Street and Huntington Ave. (In Newport News) - Intersection Mallory Avenue and King Street in Hampton, to the low bidder, T. B. Ritter and Company, Norfolk, Va., at their bid of \$396,686.35, that 10% additional be set aside to cover the cost of engineering and additional work and \$63,000.00 for Right of Way, making a total of approximately \$519,300.00 chargeable to this project. Under agreement with the Public Roads Administration \$126,475.00 State Funds by previous authorization be carried as deficit until arrangement is made to appropriate the money. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Rogers, seconded by Mr. Davis, that the Commission confirm award of contract for the construction of Project DA MR 1277 Bl-N6, Gandy Street- Naval Base, on Bay and Ocean Avenues and Intersection Maple Avenue- Intersection East First Street, on First View Street, to the one bidder, Beckler Brothers, Highland Springs, Va., at their bid of \$141,585.80, and that 10% additional be set aside to cover the cost of engineering and additional work, making a total of approximately \$155,700.00 chargeable to this project. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Rawls, seconded by General Anderson, that the Commission confirm award of contract for the construction of Project DA MR 1277 Mi., Sewall's Point Road, Granby Boulevard- Granby Street to the one bidder, R. E. Williams, Richmond, Va., at his bid of \$213,564.65, and that 10% additional be set aside to cover the cost of engineering and additional work, making a total of approximately \$234,900.00 chargeable to this project. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Wysor, seconded by Mr. Rawls, that the Commission confirm award of contract for the construction of Project PS 1410 A, Cement Concrete Flight Strip near Malfa, to the Bea Construction Company, Charlotte, N. C. and A. B. Burton Company, Lynchburg, Va., at their bid of \$509,439.00, that 10% additional be set aside to cover the cost of engineering and additional work and \$40,000.00 for Right of Way, making a total of approximately \$600,000.00 chargeable to this project; subject to concurrence in award by the Public Roads Administration. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Wysor, seconded by Mr. Rawls, that the Commission confirm award of contract for the construction of Project PS 1414 A, Flight Strip near Tappahannock, to the low bidder, R. E. Williams, Richmond, Va., and Perkins and Barnes, Blackstone, Va., at their bid of \$447,782.00; that 10% additional be set aside to cover the cost of engineering and additional work, \$3,000.00 for surveys and plans, \$40,000.00 for Right of Way for Flight Strip and \$1,200.00 for Right of Way for State Route 215, making a total of approximately \$537,082.00 chargeable to this project. An increase of 24 per square yard on concrete to be paid if water has to be secured from a mill pond two and one half miles distance. Motion carried,

Moved by Mr. Wysor, seconded by Mr. Rawls, that the Commission confirm award of contract for the construction of Project DA MR 1284 A3, B3, Route 13, 0.30 Mi. S. Intersection Route 58- 0.10 Mi. N. Intersection Route 58, to the low bidder, McDowell and Wood, Roanoke, Va., at their bid of \$321,590.39; that 10% additional be set aside to cover the cost of engineering and additional work and \$60,000.00 for right of way, making a total of approximately \$413,700.00 chargeable to this project. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Rogers, seconded by Mr. Rawls, that as provided by Chapter 212, Section 1, Act approved March 19, 1926, and upon recommendation of the Commissioner, the following sections of Route 18 in Alleghany County being no longer necessary for uses as a highway the same be abandoned upon opening of new sections in lieu thereof: Sections 1 and 2 as shown on plat dated January 29, 1942, Project 610 AL. Moved by Mr. Davis, seconded by Mr. Wysor, that as provided by Chapter 237, Act approved March 27th, 1940, and upon recommendation of the Commissioner, the following section of Route 686 in Southampton County being no longer necessary for uses as a highway the same be abandoned upon opening of new section in lieu thereof: Section 1 as shown on plat dated April 6th, 1942, Project 1348 C2, HI, and Section 2 also shown be added to the system in lieu of abandoned section. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Davis, seconded by Mr. Rogers, that as provided by Chapter 212, Section 1, Act approved March 19, 1926, and upon recommendation of the Commissioner, the following section of Route 58 in Carroll County being no longer necessary for uses as a highway the same be abandoned upon opening of new section in lieu thereof, and turned over to the Town of Galax: Section 1 as shown on plat dated January 2, 1942, Project 1065 WJHI. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Rogers, seconded by General Anderson, that the request of the Fredericksburg City Council in resolution of March 10, 1942, to widen to a four lane highway Route 1 from Four Mile Fork to the corporate limits of Fredericksburg; to erect "truck route" signs at each end of the By-pass and provide a more adequate connection between the new By-pass and Route 3, having been carefully considered by the Commission, the Chairman advise the City Council that due to the War Effort change in design on the By-pass was necessary; that signs will be erected indicating the road to be taken to Fredericksburg. Further, that our studies indicate that the two ramp approach provided at the intersection of Route 3 and the By-pass is sufficient at this time, and that consideration will be given to securing of right of way at the other two quadrants to insure space should future traffic demonstrate the necessity for additional ramps. Moved by Mr. Wycoff, seconded by General Anderson, that it be the policy of the Commission to permit the building of Service Roads along the main highways which are being thickly settled, under the following conditions:- The width required for the road, including the necessary grading, be such that it will not interfere with the future development to a predetermined standard, including the required area for landscape purposes of the main highway which such service roads parallel; surfaced width to be not less than 12 feet. That all drainage from such roads be carried in culverts to the corresponding culverts under the main highway and all utilities to be placed below the ground and as close as possible to the right of way line. The maintenance of such Service Roads to be taken care of by assessment of the property owner or by the county. The determination of what can be done in connection with the Service Road to be the responsibility of the Landscape Engineer. Before such Service Roads be permitted that a reasonable guarantee be given that provision has been made for their maintenance. In the event such roads are not properly maintained the right to use them on our right of way be discontinued. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Rogers, seconded by General Anderson, that the requests of the Carroll County Board of Supervisors to add a section of Routes 880 and 775 to the Primary System be denied, as the Commission does not see the necessity for this. Motion carried.

Moved by General Anderson, seconded by Mr. Wycoff, that the request of the Floyd County Board of Supervisors to add 2.5 (2.63) miles of Secondary Road 787 to the Primary System, be rejected as the Commission can see no need for this addition. Motion carried.

General Anderson gave the Commission a report on the payroll deduction plan for War Bonds - a total for the Department being approximately 51 percent of the employees subscribing. Eighteen Baccidencies have already subscribed 100 percent.

The Commission acted with pride that so much interest has been shown in the payroll deduction plan by all employees of the Highway Department. This program has been most ably handled by Messrs. Wilcox and Rose, and the Commission directs that the Commissioner thank these gentlemen in the name of the Commission for their work in a fine cause; and the Commission further directs that the Commissioner write a letter to each Resident Engineer complimenting the Baccidency on participation in the payroll deduction plan where such participation has reached or will reach 100 percent by July first. Further, that the Commissioner write each District Engineer and head of a major division of the Department where employee participation has reached 50 percent by July first.

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Moved by Mr. Davis, seconded by Mr. Rogers, that the conditions set up in the Retirement Act for the release from active duty of State employees be applied by the Commission to all employees of the Department, and employees who have not become members of the Retirement System be released with no provision for compensation. Carried. Motion carried.

The Commissioner presented the Members of the Commission with a copy of the Minutes of the American Society of Civil Engineers to Mr. Shirley, gotten up by Messrs. Gladden, our Bridge Engineer, and G. H. Hastings.

General Anderson read Mrs. Shirley's letter to the Commission acknowledging receipt of copy of resolution passed by the Commission naming the Shirley Memorial Highway.

General Anderson explained to the Commission an Act of the Legislature authorizing the administration of Wayside Parks. It was moved by Mr. Wyner, seconded by Mr. Rude, that the rules and regulations for the handling of such Wayside Parks be as follows:

- (1) The waysides shall be opened to the public from 8:00 A.M. to 10:30 P.M.
- (2) Overnight camping will not be permitted in waysides except on special permission by the State Highway Commissioner.
- (3) No domestic animal, except dogs, shall be permitted to enter or go at large in any wayside, either with or without a keeper. Dogs must be held in leash or under immediate control by their owners, otherwise they may be killed by any park-keeper or policeman.
- (4) No person shall pick any flowers, foliage or fruit, or cut, break, dig up, or in anyway mutilate or injure any tree, shrub, plant, grass, turf, railing, seat, fence, structure, or any thing, in any wayside, or cut, carve, paint, mark or paste on any tree, stone, fence, wall, building, monument or other object therein, any bill, advertisement, or inscription whatsoever.
- (5) No person shall distract or injure any bird, birds' nests, or eggs, or any squirrel or other animal within any of the waysides.
- (6) No person shall dig up, or remove any dirt, stones, rock or other thing whatever, make any excavation, quarry any stone or lay or set off any blast, or cause or assist in doing any of said things within any wayside, without the special order or license of the Commissioner.
- (7) No person shall ride or drive on any road within any wayside at a faster gait than fifteen miles per hour, and this shall apply to the use of cycles.
- (8) No threatening, abusive, boisterous, insulting or indecent language or gesture shall be used on any wayside. Nor shall any erection, or other public demonstration be made, unless by special authority of the Commissioner.
- (9) No person shall expose any article or thing for sale on any wayside, unless licensed therefor by said Commissioner.
- (10) No person shall bathe or fish in any waters in any wayside except in such places and subject to such regulations as the Commissioner may, from time to time, specially designate by a public notice set up for that purpose within the same.

- (13) No person shall light, kindle or use any fire on any of the waysides except at fireplaces designed and built for such purpose and that the person or persons building a fire therein will be responsible for having it completely extinguished before leaving it;
- (14) No person shall discharge or set off, on or within any wayside, any firearms, fire-crackers, torpedoes, rockets, or other fireworks, except by permit from said Commissioner.
- (15) No bottles, broken glass, ashes, waste paper, or other rubbish, shall be left in the waysides, except at such places as may be provided for the same.
- (16) No automobile or other motor vehicle shall be taken onto or driven upon any wayside except upon such drives and subject to such regulations as the Commissioner may from time to time designate by a public notice set up for that purpose within the same.
- (17) When by order of the Commissioner, certain areas, buildings or other facilities in waysides are set aside for the use of parties or for the exclusive use of white people or for colored people, others shall not stop for picnicing, meetings or loitering in any of the areas so set aside. This does not prohibit others from passing through such areas in an orderly manner, in order to reach other objectives or other areas.

Motion carried.

Moved by General Anderson, seconded by Mr. Myor, that the claim of the Blackwell Engineering and Construction Company on Project #147AK 904 E1, Route 100, Bridge over New River and NW of Barren Springs, be approved in the amount of \$1200.00 liquidated damages and \$1400.00 increased cost for which Department delays were responsible; a total of \$2600.00. Motion carried.

A copy of the 1944 Highway Legislation was presented to the Members of the Commission.

Moved by Mr. Davis, seconded by General Anderson, that the following Towns having passed proper ordinances requesting the Highway Commission to take over certain routes in the towns for maintenance, the same be accepted, including ordinances revised since their acceptance:

The Commissioners were given a copy of Maintenance Instructions, issued by the Maintenance Engineer on the Department of operations. The efforts of the Department to reduce expenses in every way was fully explained to the Commission.

Although stringent regulations regarding replacement of personnel have been in effect a very few weeks, the following comparison, showing the trend, was presented to the Commission. In May 1942 we had 1022 fewer employees on our payroll than for May 1941.

The Commissioner reported the conditions existing on Route 40 at Blackstone by the construction of a Flight Strip across this State Highway. He explained that the Department is asking the Federal Government for a suitable highway to replace this approximately 4.5 miles the Department has had to release.

Moved by General Anderson, seconded by Mr. Davis, that the thanks of the Commission be extended to Mr. Miller for the gift of photographs of the three former Highway Commissioners, Justice, P. W. Wilson, Gov. P. Galvin and H. G. Shirley, which have been placed on the wall in the Commissioner's office. Motion carried.

A full report was given the Commission concerning Federal regulations which greatly curtailed the use of Bituminous Materials for road purposes. Permission was requested to cancel any contracts that have been reduced more than 25 percent due to such restrictions, if the contractor so desires.

Moved by Mr. Davis, seconded by Mr. Wyer, that the Commissioner be authorized to cancel any Bituminous Materials contracts reduced more than 25 percent under Federal regulations, if the contractor so desires. Motion carried.

Moved by General Anderson, seconded by Mr. Wyer, that whenever a municipality which is entitled to the \$1000.00 per mile for maintenance has fulfilled necessary conditions, that the amount due it be paid and that municipalities be required to maintain their streets during the emergency to the standard set by the Department. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Wyer, seconded by General Anderson, that the overruns and underruns for the biennium 1942-1943 be balanced against each other and any remaining fund be reported to the Commission. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Davis, seconded by Mr. Rogers, that in securing right of way in Incorporated Towns of \$200 or less, as referred to in Chapter 88, Acts of 1942, the cost of such right of way not exceed 10 percent of the ultimate construction cost. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Davis, seconded by Mr. Wyer, that the Commission confirm authority for the appointment of special officers to serve as guards on important State Highway Bridges. Motion carried.

General Anderson explained fully the subject of Traffic Officer appointments. He presented a report of a committee composed of Meany, McCleary, Ferrer and Robertson, recommending the cancellation of all fresh appointments and the recalling of badges and cards.

The most important item, Re-Maintaining the allocations for the fiscal years 1940-1941, '41-'42 and '42-'43 was considered, with a statement of priorities. These not only included the regular allocations but the supplemental allocations.

The Commission considered a revision of the allocations to cover changing conditions, studying in detail projects under construction, projects completed and projects that should be pushed, and those that cannot be undertaken at this time. A full picture of what could be expected regarding revenues and the work of the Department was placed before the Commission.

No. 1 priority was placed on those projects which in the belief of the Department should be put under construction as soon as possible; No. 2 priority was given those projects to be considered after those in No. 1 class have been disposed of. Those given No. 3 priority will very likely have to be postponed for the duration of the war.

The Commission decided to hold all funds and projects for which allocations were made for the years 1940-1941, 1941-1942 and 1942-1943. It is realized that because of lack of critical materials and the "stop construction" order of the Federal Government that many projects even in the first group will not get under way soon.
