





Summary of Applications

- 321 applications submitted
- 131 entities submitted at least one application
- Requested \$6.95 billion
- Applications include other funding equal to \$6.22 billion




Summary of HB2 Applications

Validation and Screening Process

- DRPT and VDOT district staff are reviewing all applications for completeness and eligibility
- A statewide team will review 10% of all applications to ensure statewide consistency
- OIPI will screen all eligible applications to determine to determine whether the project addresses a problem identified in the VTrans2040 needs assessment
- All applications deemed ineligible will be reviewed by an Executive Working Group





SYIP HB2/HB1887 Development Policy

October

- Release list of submitted projects
- Discussion of CTB option to submit additional 2 projects
- Discussion of CTB #1 priority

December

- CTB action to add up to 2 projects, if necessary
- CTB action to identify #1 priority, if necessary

January

Release project scores to the CTB and public





Project Scorecard – January

- Sponsor, location, status, type of improvement and cost
- Project rank statewide and district based on total cost and HB2 cost
- VTrans2040 needs addressed
- Benefits in each factor
 - X,XXX reduction in person hours of delay
 - XX,XXX sq footage of economic development supported
 - XX% reduction in rate of fatalities and severe injuries
 - Etc.



SYIP Development – February

- Scenario #1 Fund top scoring projects based on rank of benefits to HB2 project costs
- Scenario #2 Fund top scoring projects based on rank of benefits to total project costs
- Scenario #1 Modified Force fund CTB's top statewide priority
- Scenario #2 Modified Force fund CTB's top statewide priority





SYIP Development – February

- For each scenario
 - High priority projects program will be selected first out of the top scoring and eligible projects
 - District grant funds will be distributed to remaining top scoring and eligible projects
- One of these scenarios will serve as the basis for the development of the SYIP
- May be modified by Board at future meetings





SYIP Development – March to April

- Board will select preferred scenario by a vote at the March meeting
- Potential modifications to preferred scenario will be identified between March and April meeting
 - High Priority Projects subcommittee of at-large members will review and recommend set of modifications to statewide selections, if necessary
 - District Grant Program applicable district member will develop set of modifications to their district's list, if necessary
- Potential modifications will be made pubic by April Board meeting





SYIP Development – April to May

- Public hearings will be held in April and May
- Board will consider recommended modifications at the May meeting
 - Chairman of at-large subcommittee will present recommended modifications to High Priority Projects program
 - Each district member will present recommended modifications to the District Grants Program
- Board will have opportunity to discuss, modify and adopt recommended modifications





SYIP Development – June and Moving Forward

- In June the Board will consider final SYIP based on final direction from the May meeting
- After June, staff will meet with unsuccessful applicants to discuss project
 - Modifications to increase benefits
 - Scope changes to reduce costs
- August 1 Round 2 Solicitation cycle starts
